


· Electronic Devices

Most cities in Solano County have switched to rolling carts for recycling, yard waste and garbage. The Single-Stream Curbside Recycling system allows users to put all recyclables in one cart. Please remember to place all items in the carts and only set out when the cart is full.

This automated collection service uses trucks that have hydraulic arms that reach toward the curb to pick up a filled cart. It is important that carts are between 4 and 5 feet apart and away from cars and other items. Their wheels should touch the curb and the lid should open toward the street.

Commercial and Multi-Residential Recycling



In 2011, Assembly Bill 341 was passed which required mandatory commercial recycling for businesses that generate four cubic yards or more of trash per week or multi-family complexes housing five units or more must subscribe to a recycling service.

Commercial Recycling

Your local garbage/recycling company will provide recycling services for your business. Most garbage companies will conduct a waste audit which will enable your business to recycle more and spend less on garbage hauling.



Multi-Family Recycling Programs

Multi-family recycling programs are tailored for each complex. Bins will vary depending on the materials that are picked up.

Garbage bills for commercial and multi-family customers are determined by the amount of trash that is generated. Recycling is often offered at no extra charge. Keeping recyclables out of the trash lowers the volume of garbage and price of garbage pickup. Customers who recycle more keep their bills low.

Electronic Waste (E-Waste)

There are hazardous materials hiding in most electronics. Televisions and computer monitors contain Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) which are hazardous waste.

Televisions, Computers & Monitors: PCs & laptops **Office Equipment:** copiers, telephones & fax machines Computer Peripherals: keyboards, printers, scanners, cables, mouses

Consumer Electronics: tape players, VCRs, PDAs, stereo equipment, radios, cell phones, etc.

Media Storage: VHS tapes, cassette tapes, CDs, etc.

*Microwave ovens and Media Storage (VHS tapes, cassette tapes, CDs, etc.) may not be accepted at E-Waste events or by E-Waste Recyclers. Call each company for more information.

How to recycle your old Smoke Detector

Solutions To Recycling Smoke Detectors

There are two types of smoke detectors sold in stores today, photoelectric and ionization.

Photoelectric detectors can be safely taken to e-waste drop off sites for recycling. Make sure to remove the battery.

Ionization detectors contain a small amount of Americium 241, (AM-241) a radioactive isotope. Ionization-based detectors are perfectly safe when in use, as the radioactive material is shielded by a metal chamber inside the smoke detector. You should never try to take apart an old ionization detector because the radioactive material may become exposed.

The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection center is not permitted to accept radioactive material, including ionization smoke detectors. Old smoke detector can be mailed back to the original manufacturer



for First Alert, BRK, or Family Guard brands, or they can be mailed to a recycling center that accepts ionization smoke detectors. Start by locating the brand name and mod-el number of the device. You can find this information in the user's manual. Then you can determine how to safely recycle your smoke alarm.

Remove the batteries before shipping.



Mattresses are bulky and difficult to transport, and public access to inexpensive recycling opportunities are very limited, so illegal dumping of mattresses is a widespread problem.

Today, when you buy a mattress, you are charged \$11 for each mattress and/or box spring. Mattress sellers are responsible for taking these items to a recycler.

The details of the program are not finalized, so call your garbage provider for current rules.

Hazardous Waste Disposal For Businesses

A business that generates less than 220 pounds or 27 gallons of hazardous waste a month is considered a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (CESQG). This program offers businesses an affordable way to comply with state laws and regulations for disposal of hazardous wastes. Wastes can be consolidated, saving each business the expense of hiring an independent waste hauler.

Protect your business and employees by disposing of unwanted, unused, and out-of-date hazardous wastes properly.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

HHW are corrosive, toxic, reactive, or flammable materials found in our homes that are illegal to put in the trash or pour down storm drains, sewers, or on the ground. Such consumer waste products, if carelessly managed, can and frequently do, create environmental and public health hazards.

Consumers can transport a maximum of 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip.

Fairfield, Suisun, Travis and Unicorporated Areas: By appt. only at Republic Services, Solano Garbage 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield. Appointments are required, call 707 437-8971. This center is open for HHW on the 2nd & 4th Saturday from 9am-12pm.

Rio Vista: Contact Rio Vista Sanitation Service at 707 374-5644 for annual HHW drop off events.

Vallejo Residents only.

Vallejo: Vallejo-Napa Household Hazardous Waste Facility located at 889A Devlin Rd, American Canyon. No appointments are necessary for this service. The center is open every Friday & Saturday from 9am to 4pm.

Please pack products carefully so they won't mix or spill. Transport in trunk if possible. The facility accepts all types of hazardous waste except: Radioactives · Explosives · Ammunition - smoke detectors. For highway safety, there is a limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.

Universal Waste (U-Waste)

Universal Wastes are hazardous wastes that contain harmful chemicals that can be released into the environment and can contaminate our air, land and water. As of February 9, 2006, the following material will be banned from disposal in household or business trash.

What is Universal Waste?

Universal waste or "U-waste" are common items that have been traditionally thrown in the trash. They are a type of hazardous waste that can't go into the trash. **They are generally accepted** at **HHW facilities listed on this page.** Some hardware stores and home improvement stores will accept rechargeable batteries and CFLs for recycling. Nation-wide: www.thermostat-recycle.org www.call2recycle.org

- All alkaline & rechargeable batteries; lead-acid batteries (auto).
- Items containing mercury: thermostats, thermometers, switches (e.g. pilot light sensors, clothes irons, blood pressure gauge, novelties such as maze games & talking greeting cards).
- Fluorescent lamps (CFLs) & tubes, metal halide lamps, sodium vapor lamps.
- Video display devices: TVs, monitors, laptops. See E-waste recycling page.

Medicine and Eye Glasses



Medicine Disposal

In 2002, the U.S. Geological Survey sampled streams in 30 states. Measurable medicine/pharmaceutical waste was found in 80% of these streams. Long-term health effects on marine life and humans are not yet determined, but it is clear that we need to keep pharmaceuticals out of the water.

What are Medicines or Pharmaceuticals?

Pharmaceuticals are prescription drugs, over-the-counter medications, or nutritional supplements used for treatment or prevention of disease in humans or animals.

One of the primary sources of pharmaceuticals in the environment comes from flushing and pouring drugs down a drain. Pharmaceuticals are water-soluble that pass through wastewater treatment facilities and go straight into our local streams.

What should you do with unwanted pharmaceuticals?

Ask your pharmacists if they are taking back pharmaceuticals.

Costco and Kaiser pharmacies sell prepaid envelopes for customers to send unwanted medicines to a disposal facility.

A statewide take-back system is in development. In the meantime, Solano County residents should save medicines for local pharmaceutical drop-off events. For information, log onto recycle.solanocounty.com, www.earth911.com or call your recycling coordinator.

LIQUIDS

Empty liquid medication onto absorbent paper towels or rags and put in the trash.

PROPELLANT INHALER

Empty container by expelling all propellant. Put the empty cylinder in trash.

PILLS

Crush, break, or dampen pills. Mix with kitty litter or used coffee grounds to make unusable.

Effective September 1, 2008, Syringes, Hypodermic Needles and Lancets - "SHARPS" - are banned from Landfills. SHARPS cannot be put in the trash. Please put then in a sealed container such as a heavy

Please put then in a sealed container such as a heavy-duty plastic or metal container with a tight-fitting lid or an FDA-approved sharps disposal container.

Break It Down!

Whether it is recyclable or trash, you can save space in the garbage, recycling and the landfill if you simply, BREAK IT DOWN! Oversized items can take up a lot of space in your garbage/recycling container. If you can crush it, fold it, or cut it to a smaller size, you could save a lot of space.

Composting

Composting is the way Mother Nature returns organic material back to the earth so that it can replenish itself.



Backyard Composting

This type of composting uses bins and is best for grass, leaves, branches, fruit, and vegetable wastes.

Bins

Make your own or purchase one: www.gardeners.com. Each garden and household is unique, so choose an appropriate bin. If you have room, you can compost without a bin in a big pile or a pit.

Composting Basics

A balance of CARBON, NITROGEN, AIR and WATER is needed to make compost. If possible collect enough materials to fill your compost bin.

Carbon Or Brown Material:

Brown, dry yard and garden materials provide the carbon balance for your pile. The smaller the pieces, the faster the compost. Examples: grass clippings, leaves, twigs, hay, flowers, vacuum dirt, pine needles, and weeds that have not gone to seed. Woody branches should be chipped.

Nitrogen Or Green Material

Green materials provide the nitrogen to the pile. Always bury food scraps deep inside the pile to avoid potential odors or pest problems. Examples: vegetable and fruit waste, coffee grounds w/ filter, tea bags, egg shells, hair, fresh grass clippings, chicken/horse/rabbit/cow manures.

Do Not Compost

Meat, Bones, Dairy Products, Greasy Foods, Diseased Plants and NEVER add cat or dog manure.

Air is essential for Aerobic Composting

Turn your pile with a compost turning tool or garden fork or use holey pipes, bundles of bamboo/corn stalks, and woody branches to add air pockets in your pile.

Bacteria, fungus and insects that live in your compost need oxygen to work. Sufficient oxygen keeps your pile sweet smelling.

Water

Keep your pile as damp as a wrung out sponge. Compost piles need about 50% moisture. Dampen layers when building the pile then add water through perforated pipes or a jet of water.

Keep a cover on open piles during hot, dry weather or rainy weather.

Composting Primer

Composting Flyers are available on the composting page at www.VALCORErecycling.org or by calling 707 55-EARTH. Local libraries also have composting books on their shelves.

Build Your Pile

by alternating equal weights of Carbon, Nitrogen. Adding a layer of finished compost or dirt will introduce bacteria to the pile.

Check weekly. If you turn your compost, it will be finished in about two months. If not, about 6 months.

Finished Compost may be used as soon as the temperature of the pile has stabilized. Finished compost has a pleasant earthy smell, few recognizable pieces of the original organic materials, and a dark brown or black color.

USES:

As A Fertilizer

Compost has a NPK (nitrogen-phosphorus-potassium) value of 1-1-1. Even with its low NPK, compost releases nutrients slowly throughout the growing season.

As A Mulch

SPREAD IT around established plants. DIG IT IN to improve soil fertility. SIFT IT into a fine mulch and use as mulch for house plants.

Make Compost Tea:

Stir 1 part aged compost into 5 parts water, let sit a few minutes, then water plants. Add water 3 or 4 more times.

FREE Composting classes. Contact your recycling coordinator. Call your water department for free WaterWise Workshops.

Earthworm Composting

Worm bins are typically used for fruit and vegetable waste from your kitchen and is designed for apartment dwellers or those with small yards. Small bins are filled with moist shredded paper, food scraps and red wiggler earthworms. [Flyer available]

Used Motor Oil Drop-Off and Bilge Pads

Why Recycle Used Oil?

Did you know that used motor oil never wears out? It just gets dirty and can be recycled, cleaned, and used again. Recycling used motor oil conserves a natural resource and is good for the environment too! Motor oil poured onto the ground, into storm drains, or tossed into trash cans (even in a sealed container) can contaminate and pollute the soil, groundwater, streams, and rivers. Recycling your used motor oil reduces this pollution threat.

About the Certified Centers

The California Integrated Waste Management Board certifies used oil recycling centers throughout the state. Certified Used Oil Collection Centers take used motor oil from the public and pay 40¢/gallon. Most centers will take up to 5 gallons at a time. Please call companies before bringing in used oil to check for space in their oil recycling barrels.

What About Contaminated Oil?

Certified center will not accept used motor oil that is contaminated with other fluids such as antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or water. If your used oil accidentally gets contaminated, it must be taken to your city's hazardous waste facility listed on Page 2.

These wastes include: Brake fluid, Car batteries, Cleaners, Oily rags, Engine degreaser, Liquid polishes, Power steering fluid, Transmission fluid, Windshield wiper fluid.

AUTO BATTERIES: (Lead Acid), Lead acid batteries can be turned in when a new battery is purchased.

TIRES: It is illegal to dump old tires in any California landfill or anywhere in the state.

The California Tire Recycling Program mandates a \$1/ per tire fee on the sale of new tires. Most tire shops will accept used tires when new tires are purchased. Some shops will charge an additional recycling fee for used tires.
