

Remembering Solano County's Jimmie E. (Jackson



For this final week of Black History Month, I'd like to honor a leader in Solano County. Jimmie E. Jackson passed away on January 17, 2023.

Mr. Jackson was born April 15, 1946 in Memphis, Tennessee to Charlie and Edith Jackson, who preceded him in death. He went to Memphis public schools and graduated from Father Bertrand High School, where he was a highly sought out football recruit. In 1964, Jimmie entered Fisk University on an athletic scholarship. In 1966, Jimmie was drafted into the military and went into the Air Force,

serving in Vietnam. In January 1967, he was stationed at Travis Air Force Base in Northern California and shortly thereafter welcomed his first daughter, Veronica.

After being honorably discharged from the Air Force in 1969, he joined the Army Reserves. In 1972, Jimmie graduated from Sacramento State University with a BA in Government and in 1978 received his MA in Public Administration from Bradford University.

In 1973, Jimmie met and married Gail (Jones) Jackson (deceased), a career Vallejo City Unified School District educator. From that

union three daughters were born, Rachelle, Patrice and Jayme (Justin), of which they both were very proud.

During Jimmie's 50 years in Solano County, he served on the Solano Community College Human Relations Committee, City of Vallejo Human Relations Commission, Solano County Fair Association, City of Vallejo Planning Commission and Solano Red Cross Board of Directors.

Jimmie was a beacon of light in his community, leading the fight for justice with grace and courage and as a valiant warrior for the NAACP. He was one of the longest standing CA NAACP Branch Presidents, leading the Vallejo Branch for 15 years, from 1977-1980 and again from 2011-2023. In addition to his leadership on the local level, he recently accepted the role of CA/HI NAACP State Area Director-North and was a CA/HI NAACP Executive Committee Member. Jimmie's impact within the Vallejo community, the CA/HI NAACP and within the NAACP Youth & College Division is one of a steadfast, dedicated freedom fighter whose fight for justice will leave hope in us all.
