Holocaust Remembrance Day



May 6, 2024, is the date this year for the Holocaust Remembrance Day. This day corresponds to the 27th Day of Nisan on the Hebrew calendar. It marks the Anniversary of the Warsaw

Ghetto Uprising. In Hebrew, Holocaust Remembrance Day is called Yom Hashoah. The purpose of this day is to remember the victims of the Nazi regime and to promote Holocaust education.

CINCO DE MAYO - May 5th, 2024



In the United States, Cinco de Mayo (May 5) has become a commercialized holiday. Some may even believe that the day celebrates Mexican Independence Day, which is incorrect.

The history of Cinco de Mayo dates to 1862 when French troops attacked a small town in Mexico called Puebla, part of the Franco-Mexican war. This let to a short battle between Mexican and French troops in which the Mexican army forced the French troops to withdraw from the war, forming a sense of *resistencia* (resistance) against French colonialism.

Traditions in parts of Mexico today include military parades, recreations of the Battle of Puebla and other festive events. For many Mexicans, however, May 5 is a day like any other: It is not a federal holiday, so offices, banks and stores remain open.

While Cinco de Mayo celebrations in the early and mid-1900s were centered around celebrating Mexican heritage, over the years festivities have become highly marketed and at times have led to cultural appropriation. So, this year, please skip the sombrero and

New Federal Grant to Help Protect Highway 37 from Flooding



The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) last week approved a \$20 million grant to the Metropolitan

Transportation Commission to help the Resilient State Route 37 partners — which include MTC, Caltrans, the California State Transportation Agency, the California Natural Resources Agency, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Bay Conservation and Development Commission, the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, SMART and the county transportation agencies in Marin, Napa, Solano and Sonoma counties — implement improvements to reduce the risk of roadway flooding and inundation along the 10-mile stretch of Highway 37 between Sears Point in Sonoma County and Mare Island in Vallejo.

FHWA awarded the grant through its Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) discretionary grant program, which was established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law enacted in 2021. Resilience improvements designed to increase Highway 37's ability to withstand winter storms and rising sea levels are scheduled to begin in 2026. These are part of an estimated \$430 million project planned for the heavily traveled North Bay corridor.

Approval of the new federal grant comes just months after the California Transportation Commission (CTC) awarded a \$50 million grant through its Local Transportation Climate Adaptation Program to help MTC and its Resilient State Route 37 partners replace the existing Highway 37 bridge over Tolay Creek in Sonoma County with a much longer span that will promote restoration of the historic

San Pablo Baylands adjacent to and north of the highway by allowing more water to flow into and out of the creek channel.


MTC is the transportation planning, financing and coordinating agency for the nine-county San Francisco Bay Area. Caltrans owns and operates the state highway system.

Help Inform MTC's 2024 Equity Priority Communities Update



The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is updating the Bay Area's designated Equity Priority Communities and invites feedback on the proposed changes by May 15.

(MTC) and the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) have developed a draft update to the geographies of the region's <u>Equity Priority Communities</u> (EPCs), which help inform long-range planning efforts such as <u>Plan Bay Area 2050+</u>, as well as funding and public engagement priorities.

While the methodology remains consistent with past updates, proposed changes to Bay Area EPCs include census tracts and updated thresholds of demographic variables based on the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) data (2018-2022).

MTC and ABAG invite your feedback on the <u>Draft 2024 EPC</u> update, which includes:

- A technical memo detailing the proposed changes;
- An <u>interactive map</u> visualizing the proposed EPCs using the latest census tract geographies; and
- <u>Comparison maps</u> showing the changes in EPCs since the last update.

Those wishing to give feedback on the proposed changes to designated Bay Area EPCs are encouraged to do so by filling out the comment form on the MTC website: www.mtc.ca.gov/2024EPC. Comments also may be submitted via email to info@planbayarea.org using the subject line "EPC Update."

Following the comment period, staff will review and leverage the feedback received to inform the Final 2024 EPC Update. The update will then be incorporated into the Plan Bay Area 2050+ Final Blueprint, currently slated for adoption in fall 2024, and will be used in the Plan Bay Area 2050+ Equity Analysis Report in 2025, among other important deliverables.

\$750,000 National Park Service Save America's Treasures Program grant awarded to the City of Vallejo



The National Park Service (NPS) announced a grant award of \$750,000 in Save America's Treasures Program grant for the city of Vallejo. The funding announced will support structural retrofit work for Quarters A on Mare Island, also known as the Admiral's Mansion, which is part of a historic district. City of Vallejo is one of 58 projects that received a grant award in 26 states through this 2023-24 competitive cycle where NPS distributed a total of \$25.7 million.

Save America's Treasures requires applicants to match the grant money dollar-for-dollar with nonfederal funding. This award of \$750,000 will leverage another \$750,000 in City funds, as well as another \$1.2 million federal earmark awarded to the Mare Island Historic Park Foundation for preservation of the Mare Island St. Peter's Chapel and Quarters A. The combined funding is expected to make significant improvements to both structures. The NPS grant period is for three years with a target completion date of September 2026.

For City Boards and Commissions, except for the Civil Service, McCune Collection, and Sister City Commissions, the Surveillance Advisory Board, and the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee, all appointed members must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interests, Form 700, within 30 days of appointment. All City Board and Commission members must complete AB 1234 Ethics training and file a Certificate of Completion within 30 days of appointment.

In most instances, to be eligible for appointment, applicants must be residents of the City of Vallejo. Information regarding the duties of each board and commission and specific criteria for appointment may be found within each application. With some exceptions, appointments are typically for a term of 4 years.

Interviews with the City Council are tentatively scheduled for the evenings of June 3 and 10. Applicants must attend the interview to be considered for appointment on a board or commission.

Building on its campaign to inform the public about high overdose rates and the growing dangers of fentanyl cloaked as prescription drugs, Solano Public Health has launched its first "One Pill Can Kill" Video Contest, the county announced this week. This initiative invites Solano County youth to create compelling videos that raise awareness of the risks of fentanyl-laced pills and promote healthier choices. Winning high school and college students can earn up to \$1,500 for their efforts.

Contest Overview:

- Objective: Engage youth in spreading critical messages about fentanyl overdose prevention through creative and impactful videos.
- **Prizes:** 1st Place: \$1,500, 2nd Place: \$1,000 and 3rd Place: \$750, with additional awards and recognition for runners-up (\$250) and other participants.
- Eligibility: Open to high school and college-aged students, 13 to 25, residing in Solano County. Teams of 1-6 members, guided by an advisor or organized independently, are encouraged to participate. Local schools and nonprofits may sponsor advisors and teams.

- Submission Deadline: Friday, May 24, 2024, by 11:59 p.m.
- Entry Requirements: Videos must be 15-120 seconds long, posted on YouTube, TikTok and/or Instagram with the hashtag #OnePillCanKillSolano, and accompanied by a completed contest entry form available at vibesolano.com.

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid drug 100 times stronger than morphine and 50 times more potent than heroin. One in four counterfeit pills contain fentanyl and nearly half of those contain a high enough dose to kill. More than 100,000 Americans died of an overdose in 2023. In Solano County, at least 100 Solano County residents died of an overdose in 2023, with about 70 of those being opioid overdoses.

How to apply:

- No later than 05/15/2024, mail the completed application and all supporting documentation to RTSC, PO Box 5996, Vallejo, CA 94591.

Qualifications Required:

- One or more household members must qualify as Military (Active, honorably discharged, retired or a surviving spouse of military);
- Own and live in a single-family residence located within Solano County. Home to be stick-built;
- The following items must be paid current: 1) Mortgage(s) 2) Property Taxes 3) Homeowner's Insurance;
- Potential homeowners cannot own other property or units unless located on the property of the primary residence;
- Household Income must fall below the low-income guidelines for Solano County (less than 80% of Area Median Income for 2024)


Solano County's New Job Applicant System

Solano County Superior Court seeks applicants for Civil Grand Jury



The Honorable Alesia Jones, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Solano County, announced that the Court is seeking volunteers to serve as jurors on the 2024-2025 Civil Grand Jury. Residents who have lived in the county for one year, are a United States citizen and are 18 years of age or older, may apply for service.

The grand jury is an historic institution and serves an important role in our society. It is sometimes referred to as the "watchdog" of the community. It functions as an arm of the judicial branch of government and operates under the authority of the Solano Superior Court.

The grand jury investigates and reports on the operations, accounts, and records of local government and has the power to investigate citizen complaints about local government. Empowered by the judicial branch, the grand jury is a fact-finding body that develops meaningful solutions to a wide range of governmental issues, thereby facilitating positive change in the community.
