# UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF THE HELD THURSDAY, JANUARY 8, 2009 COUNTY ADMINISTRATION CENTER - FIRST FLOOR HEARING ROOM, 675 TEXAS STREET FAIRFIELD, CALIFORNIA

#### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chair Hermsmeyer called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Tanner-Linne called roll. A quorum was confirmed.

#### 2. Approval of Minutes for December 3, 2008 Meeting

Motion to approve (Leong), seconded (Riddle). December 3, 2008 minutes approved unanimously.

#### 3. Approval of Agenda

Motion to approve agenda (Leong), second (Riddle). Approved unanimously.

#### 4. Chair Announcements and Commissioner Comments

- A. Hermsmeyer introduced Michael Whited, the new District 3 Park and Recreation Commissioner appointed by Supervisor Spering.
- B. Hermsmeyer recognized the Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund Evaluation Committee for their willingness to volunteer and serve on this Committee, and said he was proud of the work they have done.

#### 5. Parks and Recreation Division Staff Report (Informational Only)

- A. Staff Sykes provided the attached park activities report (see attached).
- B. Sykes thanked the members of the Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund Evaluation Committee for their hard work and reported the Board of Supervisors had approved the Commission's recommended funding for the grants on January 6, 2009.

Leong asked if a graph could be made to show the attendance for this year and last for each park. Sykes said Staff is working on a method of tracking attendance better that will allow that to happen, and should have a better method to present at a meeting in the near future.

Alvarez stated that during the swearing-in of the new County Supervisor Linda Seifert (District 2), she indicated one of her goals was to create a regional park district. Alvarez suggested staff make a report of the recent years' accomplishments of the County Parks and Recreation Division to the Board of Supervisors. The recent progress in the County Parks

Division may inform the Supervisors in their decision-making. A park district would create another layer of government and additional taxes for our citizens.

Whited asked Staff if camping fees would be increased at Lake Solano Park to pay for the building of the Lake Solano Nature Center. Staff Sykes said that no, there were no plans to do that. (The Nature Center construction is already fully funded.)

Hermsmeyer noted that Belden's Landing generated revenues of over \$6,000 last month, and if there were additional parking it could generate additional revenues.

#### 6. Election of Commission Chair and Vice-Chair

Motion to nominate Steve Hermsmeyer as Chair of the Park and Recreation Commission for 2009 (Alvarez), seconded (Riddle). The vote was unanimous.

Motion to nominate Michael Whited as Vice-Chair (Hermsmeyer), seconded (Riddle). The vote was unanimous.

#### 7. Set Calendar of Commission Meetings for 2009

Motion to accept the calendar (Riddle), seconded (Leong). The vote was unanimous.

#### 8. Approval of Public Access Success Criteria for Lynch Canyon

Sykes presented the criteria. The overall goal is to build a strong user program for Lynch Canyon.

Whited asked the hours Lynch Canyon was open. Sykes: every day except Monday and Tuesday from 8 am – dusk.

Hermsmeyer asked if additional events were going to be added. Sykes stated this was the complete list.

Alvarez suggested marketing the parks and using the Benicia television station as a tool.

Leong thought this was great and something the commission could boast about; however there are no photographer events where we could reach the photographer clubs in the area where they might want to take pictures of wild flowers or sunsets.

Motion to approve the Public Access Success Criteria for Lynch Canyon in its original written form and staff should take comments from the Commission back to the Lynch Canyon Working Committee for consideration (Leong). Seconded (Riddle). The vote was unanimous.

#### 9. Review and Provide Direction on Application Procedures for Suisun Marsh-Specific Fund, Grant Program

Staff presented the application from the previous, Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund process, with notations for needed changes to accommodate the new requirements of the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund, as per the "Guidelines for the Kinder Morgan Settlement Funds" approved by the Board of Supervisors in January 2008.

Hermsmeyer appointed an Ad Hoc Evaluation Committee of Dimitrios Georges (Chair), Walt Sommers and himself. Hermsmeyer directed the Committee to review and revise the application and procedural guide for the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund Grant Program. Hermsmeyer said he would like to recommend one additional committee member but could do that at the next meeting.

Motion to approve the two pages submitted by staff for changes (Hermsmeyer), seconded (Whited). The vote was unanimous in favor.

Hermsmeyer requested the revised application be presented again to the Commission at a future meeting for review by the Commission and the public.

#### 10. Public Comments

Steve Chappell of Suisun Resource Conservation District stated he would be submitting in writing his thoughts on the application (letter is attached).

Alvarez stated in the past years working with the Benicia Parks and Recreation if a grant application was not complete or wrong it was denied and there was not a second chance. He also stated there should be workshops for the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund Grant Application and felt the workshops will add additional information for applicants.

Riddle stated he also thought there should be training and workshops for the new applications; however, it is not the work of the Commission to do the applicant's job.

Jerry Emmanuelson requested that applicant presentations be allowed to be made prior to the Evaluation Committee making its recommendations. He also recommended that the applicant workshop be stressed as more important for applicants to attend.

#### 11. Adjournment:

The next meeting of the Commission was confirmed for March 12, 2009 at 5:30 pm. Meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

#### PARKS ACTIVITIES REPORT

- Belden's Landing: In December 2008, attendance was an estimated 4,670 people and parking revenue was \$6,671. County Public Works Staff recently completed a re-striping of the parking lot. Defective parts on the fee collection machine were replaced in early December.
- 2. Lynch Canyon Open Space: In December 2008, attendance was an estimated 564 people and parking revenue was \$1,129. Solano Land Trust has informed the County that they are considering a proposal for an electrical switching yard within the park, associated with a new power plant proposal in Fairfield.
- Sandy Beach Park: In December 2008, attendance was an estimated 3,036 people and revenue was \$6,413. Staff attended a CPRS leadership training course. Staff also put on a workshop for other park rangers on Street Gang Awareness on Dec. 19, 2008. A project to replace two old sewage pumps at the south campground restroom is ongoing.
- 4. <u>Lake Solano Park</u>: In December 2008, parking and camping revenue was \$14,085. Construction of the Lake Solano Nature Center is 92% complete. First to move in will be Ranger Staff, as soon as furniture is ordered and arrives. Staff is also working on planning the Center's exhibits, including aquariums, and educational programming. A date for a grand opening is still being set, but is tentatively scheduled for late spring 2009.

#### Dan and Marilea,

At the request of Chairman Hermsmeyer, the Suisun Resource Conservation District (SRCD) is submitting the following comments for consideration in amending the Application Procedures for the 2009 Suisun Marsh Specific Kinder Morgan Grant Program.

SRCD appreciates this opportunity to provide the following brief requests for modification to the grant application package, grant review process and applicant's presentation to the ad hoc committee and the full Park and Recreation Commission.

#### **Eligible Applicants**

Page 8. of the current language reads "Eligible entities that may receive award of grant funds under this program include public entities, including special districts, organized under federal, state or local laws, accredited educational institutions and private non-profit organizations with current 501C(3) status." SRCD requests that private landowners within the Suisun Marsh can apply for funding to conduct wetland restoration and enhancement projects. The current application package for the Solano County Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund Grant Program excludes private landowners from applying for this grant opportunity. Approximately 80 % of the Suisun Marsh is held privately, which includes those properties that were directly impacted from the diesel spill and subsequent cleanup activities.

#### **Land Tenure Requirements**

Please clarify the language defining land tenure. Please define the documentation you require or provide a list of acceptable documents.

#### Presentations

Timing of presentations should be scheduled so that ad hoc committee can freely ask questions of applicants and details of the projects. This information can then be incorporated into the evaluation ranking and recommendation to fund. Subsequently. The applicants could still make an informational presentation before the full Parks and Recreation Commission. This will also allow evaluators a time to clarify any questions or concerns in and informal manor prior to making final funding recommendations.

#### **Environmental Documentation**

Allow SRCD and DFG to submit to the County one file containing all supporting environmental documentation for the Suisun Marsh wetland habitat enhancement projects. SRCD and DFG hold the permits for wetland restoration and enhancement projects in the Primary Marsh on public and private lands. This documentation will be identical for all applications pertaining to Suisun Marsh enhancement and restoration projects. Example NEPA/CEQA documentation and U. S. Army Corps of Engineer permits.

#### **Notification Letter**

In the previous funding cycle of the Solano County Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund Grant Program. County Council drafted a letter and notified all applicants that there *may* be items missing from the application. Applicants would have not knowingly submitted incomplete applications. We request the letter include the items the individual application has omitted with a deadline for submittal or they be disqualified.

# PARKS AND RECREATION FY 09/10 RECOMMENDED FEE SCHEDULE JUSTIFICATIONS

There are a number of new fees that have an increase for non-county resident use of County Park facilities, a surcharge that is similarly charged at other park agencies for non-resident users. This increase addresses the fact that Solano County Parks, which are supported by County resident tax dollars, are also used by non-County residents. The revised fees for non-county residents are numbers: 008, 010, 012, 014, 016, 018, 020, 022, 029, 032, 035, 037, 039, 041, 048, and 050.

Three new **reduced** fees are proposed. Two fees are reduced for smaller groups using the Lake Solano Park Youth Group Area. These fees reduce the charge for small groups of 20 people or less, who have less impact on staff resources and facilities than larger groups. In addition, the bus parking fee is proposed to be waived for publicly funded school activities. These are Fee numbers **006**, **021** & **049**.

Two new fees have been added to account for the practice of campers who hook up multiple recreational vehicles to the electrical and sewer hook-ups in a single campsite. The fees account for the additional electricity and sewage pumping costs associated with this use. These Fees are numbers **030** and **033**.

A new fee is added for boat launching at three of the parks. This is a modest fee to partially offset the maintenance costs of aging ramps and docks used for boat launching, and is comparable (or less) than launch fees charged by comparable marina facilities and park agencies. This is Fee number **056**.

New fees have been added related to holding events in the parks, including an event permit processing fee, an hourly fee for dedicated Ranger services, and fees to allow for rental of the Lake Solano Nature Center, which is newly completed (room rental, set-up, and associated fees). These fees are based on a review of fees charged by other comparable park agencies, and include reduced rental fees for non-profit groups and public agencies. These are Fee numbers **057-067**.

#### **SUMMARY:**

County Staff recommends that the Commission approve the attached procedural guide for the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund (SMSF) grant program for Fiscal Year 2008/09 and direct staff to distribute it to the public. The procedural guide includes the grant application, sample contract, deadlines and all other relevant information applicants will need to apply for and receive grants.

<u>Note</u>: To facilitate easier review, the <u>significant</u>, <u>proposed changes</u> to the procedural guide are in the **DARKER FONT**, while the existing portions of the previous procedural guide that are still relevant are in a lighter font. (Minor changes, however, such as dates or fund names are not specifically indicated).

#### DISCUSSION:

A procedural guide for the fiscal year 2008/09 Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund (FWPF) Grant Program was approved by this Commission in July 2008. In preparation for the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund grant program, the Commission reviewed the original FWPF procedural guide at the January 8, 2009 meeting and appointed an ad hoc committee, the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund Evaluation Committe.

The Evaluation Committee was directed by the Commission to revise the FWPF Procedural Guide to fit the specific requirements of the Suisun Marsh Specific Fund (SMSF), as described in the "Guidelines for the Kinder Morgan Settlement Funds" as approved by the Solano County Board of Supervisors (Item 31 of Board Agenda of January 22, 2008). Many of the sections of the FWPF Procedural Guide are still applicable (e.g., grant contract, payment requests, etc.) and so do not need to be changed.

<u>Note</u>: To facilitate easier review by the Commission and public, the <u>significant</u>, <u>proposed</u> <u>changes</u> to the procedural guide are in the **DARKER FONT**, while the existing portions of the previous procedural guide that are still relevant are in a lighter font. (Minor changes, however, such as dates or fund names are not specifically indicated).

In Fiscal Year 2008/09, the Board has budgeted \$100,000 from the SMSF to be disbursed as competitive grants. Staff recommends that the Commission review and approve the SMSF Procedural Guide and direct Staff to distribute it to the public to begin the grant application process.
