Sheriff's Serve Narcotics Search Warrant Solano County Sheriff's Office

July 29, 2010

After a 2-month-long investigation, the Solano County Sheriff's Cal-MMET (California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team), Sol-NET (Solano Narcotics Enforcement Team), and the Vallejo Police Department's Crime Suppression Unit executed a search warrant on the 700 block of Curtola Parkway, in the city of Vallejo.

Detectives found almost a quarter ounce of methamphetamine packaged for sale, an ounce of marijuana packaged for sale, amphetamine pills, ecstasy pills, digital scales, and indicia supporting sales of illicit drugs. A stolen .38 caliber handgun along with ammunition was also recovered during the search. The firearm was reported stolen out of Angels Camp, California in 2007. Child Protective Services (CPS) was called to the residence to take a 5-week-old infant that was removed from the residence under California's Drug Endangered Children laws.

Arrested at the residence were 43-year-old Derwin Anthony Cooper of Vallejo, 19-year old Justin Stancliff of Vallejo, 24-year-old Tiana Naples of Vallejo, 44-year-old Larry Naples of Vallejo, and 39-year-old Sarah Pinkham of Vallejo. Cooper was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance for sale, and possession of marijuana for sale with a bail set at \$25,000. Stancliff was arrested for possession of methamphetamine for sale with a bail set at \$15,000. Tiana Naples was arrested for possession of stolen property with a bail set at \$15,000. Larry Naples was arrested for being a parolee at large, a convicted felon in possession of ammunition, and a convicted felon in possession of a firearm. He is being held without bail. Pinkham was arrested for possession of methamphetamine with a bail set at \$15,000. All individuals were booked into the Solano County Jail for the above mentioned charges.

Detectives estimate the street value of all the drugs seized to be valued at \$1,120 between the methamphetamine, amphetamine pills, ecstasy, and marijuana.
