Curiosity Quest Goes Green is an upbeat, family educational program that explores what the community is curious about. Some of the topics include recycling of bottles and cans, HHW, and sustainability topics to name a few. In each show, host, Joel Greene, ventures on a quest in response to viewer's letters of curiosity. Each quest takes viewers on location for an unscripted, hands-on exploration.

The first two seasons recently came up for media rights and we are now offering it to the local cities as programming for their local city channels. Other cities including Murrieta, Rialto, Huntington Beach, Rancho Cucamonga, Rancho Mirage, Indio, Palm Springs, Palm Desert, Cathedral City and many more have seen it as an unique way to spend their Department of Conservation funds or available Environmental funds because the programming shows environmental stewardship and provides an upbeat family educational show instead of the usual billboards and advertisements like most city channels. It is actually the only Environmental show aimed at kids!

In addition to broadcasting episodes of *Curiosity Quest Goes Green* on their local city channels, some of the cities that we are working with are utilizing the episodes within their local schools and/or within their own departments in the following manner(s):

- Cable access channel is viewed in classrooms
- Some cities transfer the episodes from the DVDs to a server and then send out a notice to the local schools that they can check-out the DVDs from the local library or they put the DVDs in the schools' libraries once educators are aware of the episodes being readily available, they are usually very excited because they are viewed as a great resource
- Use the episodes as tools to educate on a certain topic

In general, most of the ways our content is being utilized by other cities includes within schools, libraries, local tv networks/channels, within departments for any educational purposes, and within a closed circuit website.

<u>POSSIBLE THINGS TO INCLUDE</u>: We'd love to hear the projects you've done relating to climate change or nature or conservation -- whether they're science projects or community clean ups! Below are ideas of what you might talk about in a film, but we are happy for you to send us whatever is most on your mind.

This show is for children. Would you introduce yourself - your name, your age, where you're from?

Would you describe where you live? What's the landscape/the climate zone like? (Desert, mountain, city, coast, forest...) Describe the animals and plants that live there so we can imagine.

Would you describe Coastal Cleanup day? What is it? Where are you volunteering? What is it you're doing? What inspired you to get involved?

What should people know about the ocean?

Tell us about what concerns you about the ocean. Why do we need to worry about the seas and everything that makes up our earth? It's so big – won't it just take care of itself?

Please share any tips for kids or grown ups on how to take care of the oceans. List one or two or three or ten or twenty – big or small. Kids can't vote; can they actually make change in the world? How?

What should we do with our trash? We make so much of it!

What is your wish for the planet?
