Department of Technology releases public survey on internet use and adoption

The California Department of Technology has released their public survey on internet use and adoption. This information will inform California's State Digital Equity Plan and help California design solutions to ensure that all California residents have access to high quality and affordable internet service, devices, skills training, and digital support. The survey is available in 14 languages: English, Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, Tagalog, Korean, Armenian, Persian/Farsi, Arabic, Russian, Japanese, Punjabi, and Khmer. New area code joins 530 region



The California Public Utilites Commission (CPUC) has acted to ensure that telephone numbers continue to be available to meet the demand in the geographic region served by the 530 area code by approving a second area code (called an overlay) that will provide additional numbering

resources while minimizing customer inconvenience. The new area code to overlay the 530 area codes is 837.

The 530 area code is projected to run out of available prefixes (the first three numbers after the area code in a telephone number) during the third quarter of 2025. The CPUC approved the request of the North American Numbering Plan Administrator, the neutral third-party area code relief planner for California, for an area code overlay. No existing customers will be required to change their area code or specific telephone number. The new overlay area code of 837 will be available for new telephone number assignments in the same region

It serves cities and communities including but not limited to Chico, Davis, El Dorado Hills, Oroville, Paradise, Placerville, Red Bluff, Redding, South Lake Tahoe, Truckee, Woodland, and Yuba City, as well as unincorporated areas.

State to launch BenefitsCal.com selfservice website in Solano County

The Solano County Department of Health and Social Services, Employment and Eligibility division, announced that on **Monday, July 3**, the State of California will launch the new BenefitsCal.com website in Solano County, giving customers who apply for and receive CalFresh, CalWORKs and Medi-Cal services, access to these benefits in a single online platform.

The state will begin migrating Solano County customers to the BenefitsCal.com platform starting on Thursday, June 29 at 2pm. During the transition, Solano County Employment and Eligibility (E&E) customers will not be able to access their accounts until the website launches on July 3 at 8am.

In advance of the planned outage, Solano County E&E staff is encouraging all customers act now so they are not (or minimally) impacted during the transition, including submitting any incomplete applications, outstanding reports and required verifications as soon as possible. During the cutover window, E&E staff will not have access to process benefit transactions.

Solano County E&E offices will remain open during the transition to BenefitsCal.com, but services will be limited. Customers can visit and/or call a County E&E office with questions, including at 275 Beck Ave. in Fairfield, (707) 553-5000; 365 Tuolumne Street in Vallejo, (707) 784-8050; and 1119 E. Monte Vista Ave. in Vacaville, (707) 469-4500, all between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday – Friday. More information can also be found on the County website


