Weekend closure on WB SR-37 is scheduled for the weekend of **April 26.** WB SR-37 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the WB SR-37 Connector Off-ramp to SR-29 in Vallejo.

Closures will start Friday, April 26 at 9 p.m. and conclude the following Monday, April 29 at 4 a.m.

WB SR-37 DETOUR:

Motorists traveling westbound on SR-37 will need to exit right onto northbound SR-29 (Sonoma Blvd) in Vallejo and continue on NB SR-29 (Broadway) in American Canyon to SR-29/SR-12; then turn left and continue on SR-12/SR-121 (Carneros Hwy/Fremont Dr); turn left on SR-121 (Arnold Drive) and make a right back onto WB SR-37.

EB SR-37 DETOUR:



Weekend closures on eastbound (EB) SR-37 is scheduled on the weekend of **May 3 & May 10.** EB SR-37 will be closed and traffic detoured beginning at the NB SR-121 (Sears Point) in Sonoma.

Closures will start Friday, May 3 at 9 p.m. and conclude on the following Monday, May 6 at 5 a.m.

The following weekend, closures will start Friday, May 10 at 9 p.m. and conclude on the following Monday, May 13 at 5 a.m.

Motorists traveling eastbound on SR-37 will need to exit left onto northbound SR-121 in Sonoma; Make a right on SR-12/SR-

121(Carneros Hwy) and continue; Right on SR-12/SR-29; Enter left for the connector loop Off-ramp back to EB SR-37.

Please note that all work is weather dependent. The weekends of May 3 and May 10 are scheduled as contingency if any scheduled work is delayed or postponed.

Man sentenced to five years in prison for trafficking firearms in Vallejo



The U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of California announced this week that Jeremy Michael Benner, 40, of San Diego, was sentenced

to five years in prison to be followed by three years of supervised release for unlawfully dealing in firearms.

According to court documents, between September 2022 and August 2023, Benner sold firearms to a confidential informant on four separate occasions in Vallejo. One of the firearms had previously been reported stolen, and three of them came with extended magazines. Benner did not have a license as a firearms dealer, and as a previously convicted felon would not be qualified to obtain a license.

This case was the product of an investigation by the FBI's Solano County Violent Crimes Task Force and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. Assistant U.S. Attorney Adrian T. Kinsella prosecuted the case.

Garamendi update

Help Inform MTC's 2024 Equity Priority Communities Update



The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is updating the Bay Area's designated Equity Priority Communities and invites feedback on the proposed changes by May 15.

(MTC) and the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) have developed a draft update to the geographies of the region's <u>Equity Priority Communities</u> (EPCs), which help inform long-range planning efforts such as <u>Plan Bay Area 2050+</u>, as well as funding and public engagement priorities.

While the methodology remains consistent with past updates, proposed changes to Bay Area EPCs include census tracts and updated thresholds of demographic variables based on the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) data (2018-2022).

MTC and ABAG invite your feedback on the <u>Draft 2024 EPC update</u>, which includes:

- A technical memo detailing the proposed changes;
- An <u>interactive map</u> visualizing the proposed EPCs using the latest census tract geographies; and
- <u>Comparison maps</u> showing the changes in EPCs since the last update.

Those wishing to give feedback on the proposed changes to designated Bay Area EPCs are encouraged to do so by filling out the comment form on the MTC website: www.mtc.ca.gov/2024EPC. Comments also may be submitted via email to info@planbayarea.org using the subject line "EPC Update."

Following the comment period, staff will review and leverage the feedback received to inform the Final 2024 EPC Update. The update will then be incorporated into the Plan Bay Area 2050+ Final Blueprint, currently slated for adoption in fall 2024, and will be used in the Plan Bay Area 2050+ Equity Analysis Report in 2025, among other important deliverables.

The city of Benicia is working on developing an Industrial Safety Ordinance (ISO) in Benicia. An ISO aims to reduce accidental release of hazardous chemicals, improve accident prevention through community and industry participation, improve local air monitoring, and improve community transparency.

Officials are inviting everyone to complete a short, 14-question survey to help inform the process. This survey is designed to gather community insights and opinions on local air quality, environmental

safety, and the implementation of an Industrial Safety Ordinance (ISO) in Benicia.

SR-37 Express Bus/Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan



The Solano Transportation Authority (STA) Board approved the California State Route 37 (SR-37) Express Bus/Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan during its April 10, 2024, Board meeting.

STA, in partnership with MTC, Caltrans, Napa, Marin, and Sonoma County, has developed a detailed transit service/TDM plan for the SR-37 corridor.

The California SR-37 Express Bus/TDM Plan explores four alternatives based on connectivity to other transit services, first/last mile access, and illustrates the high end of capital and operating costs for planning purposes. The report initially recommends vanpool options for this corridor because of reduced startup costs and the flexibility of reaching multiple destinations. The report includes a detailed phased and tiered service plan that includes route alignments, stop locations, equipment needs, contractual arrangements with partner agencies (e.g., use of San Rafael Transit Center), alternative transit options, capital procurement, Green House Gas (GHG) and Vehicle Miles Travel (VMT) impacts.

Building on its campaign to inform the public about high overdose rates and the growing dangers of fentanyl cloaked as prescription drugs, Solano Public Health has launched its first "One Pill Can Kill" Video Contest, the county announced this week. This initiative invites Solano County youth to create compelling videos that raise awareness of the risks of fentanyl-laced pills and promote healthier choices. Winning high school and college students can earn up to \$1,500 for their efforts.

Contest Overview:

- Objective: Engage youth in spreading critical messages about fentanyl overdose prevention through creative and impactful videos.
- **Prizes:** 1st Place: \$1,500, 2nd Place: \$1,000 and 3rd Place: \$750, with additional awards and recognition for runners-up (\$250) and other participants.
- Eligibility: Open to high school and college-aged students, 13 to 25, residing in Solano County. Teams of 1-6 members, guided by an advisor or organized independently, are encouraged to participate. Local schools and nonprofits may sponsor advisors and teams.
- Submission Deadline: Friday, May 24, 2024, by 11:59 p.m.
- Entry Requirements: Videos must be 15-120 seconds long, posted on YouTube, TikTok and/or Instagram with the hashtag #OnePillCanKillSolano, and accompanied by a completed contest entry form available at vibesolano.com.

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid drug 100 times stronger than morphine and 50 times more potent than heroin. One in four counterfeit pills contain fentanyl and nearly half of those contain a high enough dose to kill. More than 100,000 Americans died of an overdose in 2023. In Solano County, at least 100 Solano County residents died of an overdose in 2023, with about 70 of those being opioid overdoses.



Solano County Superior Court seeks applicants for Civil Grand Jury



The Honorable Alesia Jones, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Solano County, announced that the Court is seeking volunteers to serve as jurors on the 2024-2025 Civil Grand Jury. Residents who have lived in the county for one year, are a United States citizen and are 18 years of age or older, may apply for service.

The grand jury is an historic institution and serves an important role in our society. It is sometimes referred to as the "watchdog" of the community. It functions as an arm of the judicial branch of government and operates under the authority of the Solano Superior Court.

The grand jury investigates and reports on the operations, accounts, and records of local government and has the power to investigate citizen complaints about local government. Empowered by the judicial branch, the grand jury is a fact-finding body that develops meaningful solutions to a wide range of governmental issues, thereby facilitating positive change in the community.

Although this is primarily a civic responsibility, grand jurors are paid a \$20 per diem and are paid mileage reimbursement for each authorized meeting.







Fairfield To Host Compost Giveaway Day



The city of Fairfield and Republic Services are holding a free compost giveaway event for Fairfield residents from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, April 27 at the Dunnell Nature Park and Education Center at 3351 Hillridge Drive in Fairfield.

No appointment is necessary; however, proof of residency is required. Master Gardeners from the UCCE Solano will be onsite to provide residents with information about compost uses and other horticultural tips and

tricks.

The compost will be delivered in bulk and residents should bring their own containers/ bags to fill up and take home. Residents can take as much compost as they want while supplies last. This is a self-serve event, but shovels and gloves will be provided for use.

The compost is from Northern Compost (Yolo County) and is listed by the Organic Materials Review Institute (OMRI) for use in organic production, approved as an Organic Input Fertilizing Material by the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), and is certified with the United States Composting Council's Seal of Testing Assurance. The compost is made from recycled green material, food waste, and woody material collected from residential organic carts.

The compost giveaway events are part of the City's sustainability and Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) goals. If you would like to volunteer at the giveaway, please call the number below.

Fairfield Police joins DEA for National Prescription Drug Take Back Day April 27


From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., on Saturday, April 27 in coordination with the Drug Enforcement Agency, the Fairfield Police Department will host DEA's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day at 1000 Webster Street. They will collect tablets, capsules, patches, and other solid forms of prescription drugs.

For more than a decade, the event has helped Americans easily rid their homes of unneeded medications—those that are old, unwanted, or expired—that too often become a gateway to addiction. In partnership with local law enforcement, Take Back Day has removed 8,950 tons of medication from circulation since its inception.

Collection sites will not accept syringes, sharps, and illicit drugs. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container. The cap must be tightly sealed to prevent leakage. Take Back Day offers free and anonymous disposal of unneeded medications at close to 5,000 local drop-off locations nationwide.

Benicia PD drug buyback



Benicia police will participate in this year's National Prescription Drug Take-back Day, which will take place from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Saturday, April 27, Benicia Police Department - 200 East L Street.

This program is anonymous, and all efforts will be made to protect the anonymity of individuals disposing of medications. No questions or requests for identification will be made. Law enforcement personnel will be overseeing the surrender process to ensure collection site protocols are adhered to.

All participants must retain possession of their own medications during the surrender process. Law enforcement personnel will not handle the medications at any time prior to, and during placement into the designated disposal boxes.

Law enforcement personnel will not count, inventory, or log medications being surrendered.

ACCEPTED:

- Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container (non-liquids only) and disposing of it directly into the designated disposal box.
- If an original container is submitted, we encourage you to remove all identifying information from the prescription label.
- All solid dosage pharmaceutical products and liquids in consumer containers may be accepted, however, you must ensure that the cap is tightly sealed to prevent leakage.
- Liquid products, such as cough syrup, must remain sealed in their original container.
- Vape pens and e-cigarettes with removable batteries will be accepted after the batteries are removed. You must show proof of battery removal to law enforcement personnel.
- Inhalers and nebulizers with removable batteries will be accepted after the batteries are removed. You must show proof of battery removal to law enforcement personnel.
- Non-battery-operated inhalers will be accepted.

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Intra-venous solutions, injectables, and syringes
 WILL NOT be accepted due to the potential hazard posed by blood-borne pathogens.
- Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not part of the initiative and WILL NOT be accepted.

 Vape pens and inhalers with non-removable batteries WILL NOT be accepted. They pose a danger to law enforcement personnel and incinerator staff involved in the destruction phase of the NTBI process, because they may explore in the incinerator.
