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RESOURCE MANAGEMENT SUBMITTAL DEADLINE

LNU Lightning Complex Fire – Fire Debris and Ash Removal Right of Entry and Work Plan submittal deadline: extended to February 1, 2021

The potential for widespread toxic exposures and threats to public health and the environment exists in the aftermath of the LNU Lightning Complex Fire. Debris and ash from residential structure fires can contain hazardous substances and the health effects of hazardous substances releases after a wildfire are well documented. Exposure to hazardous substances may lead to acute and chronic health effects, and may potentially cause long-term public health and environmental impacts.

Properties which experienced damage to structures due to the LNU Lightning Complex Fire are required to clean up the property to State and local standards. Cleanup may be completed by submittal and approval of:

- EITHER** a Right of Entry application to allow local, State, and federal contractors to perform the cleanup at no cost to the property owner,
- OR** a private Work Plan which describes how private contractors hired by the property owner will complete the cleanup.

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 2020-1813U, which was adopted by the Solano County Board of Supervisors on October 27, 2020, the deadline to submit either a Right of Entry or Work Plan application has been extended to:

February 1, 2021

Properties for which no Right of Entry or private Work Plan has been received by February 1, 2021 will be enrolled in the Summary Abatement process whereby the property will be cleaned up and the property owners invoiced for that service.
