e-5 - DROWNING/NEAR DROWNING

PRIORITIES:

- ABCs
- Treat hypoxia
- Protect C-Spine
- Minimize time at scene
- Full arrest should be stabilized at scene
- Assure an advanced life support response
- Consider associated trauma to C-Spine to be present until proven otherwise

Drowning

Loss of consciousness in water, no in full arrest

1. Treat as CARDIOPULMONARY ARREST, with considerations for hypothermia and spinal precautions.

Near Drowning

Loss of consciousness in water, NOT in full arrest.

- 1. Ensure a patent airway (suction as necessary)
- 2. Be prepared to support ventilation with appropriate airway adjuncts and OXYGEN THERAPY as appropriate;
- 3. Protect the cervical spine, if neck injury suspected;
- 4. Anticipate vomiting. Take precautions against aspiration; be prepared for suctioning;
- 5. Remove wet clothing; keep patient warm and dry;
- 6. Monitor vital signs frequently;
- 7. Assist advanced life support personnel with patient packaging and movement to ambulance.
