Proposers' Questions & Answers

Q1. How does Learning for Action's methodology in the Chicago program compare to the Solano program?

A1. Learning for Action utilized a similar methodology for the "Solano County Nonprofit Capacity Diagnostic, Findings and Recommendations" as was used in the Chicago "Point the Way" project. This consisted of a capacity building landscape analysis to identify the capacity building needs of local nonprofits; a report on the findings; and, recommendations based on the diagnostic assessment.

Q2. Are the "experts" brought in on the different session dates experts in different phases and objectives of the program?

A2. The facilitators/coaches are professionals who are active in the field of nonprofit capacity building and experts in this field in general, with specific knowledge about the Vision and Impact Model.

Q3. Do the 3 phases/objectives of the program correspond with the 3 class sessions?

A3. Yes

Q4. About how much time will be required between sessions?

A4. The time required between sessions will vary by agency based on many factors.
