At present, The ICU and ventilator capacity are in the 'good' range.

We are continuing to respond to the COVID-19 situation, by investigating outbreaks, tracing contacts and monitoring the number of cases and hospital capacity, to protect the health of Solano County residents. We will follow State guidance on reopening additional sectors, and will move forward on reopening them in our County based on local conditions.

Solano County and increasing contact tracing to reopen safely

Solano County is increasing its COVID-19 contact tracing efforts to train additional contact tracers. Contact tracing has been used by public health for decades to slow the spread of infectious disease. Contact tracers connect with people who are COVID-19 positive, so they can get medical care and trace who they might have exposed without knowing it, so those individuals can be contacted, too. Reopening Solano County Safely

Additional businesses can reopen with modifications

Solano Public Health has amended the County's stay at home order and directive, giving certain business sectors the permission to reopen as long as they meet the guidance criteria. The new business sectors include:

- Family entertainment centers
- Wineries and bars
- Zoos and museums
- Gyms and fitness centers
- Hotels for travel and tourism
- Cardrooms and racetracks
- Campgrounds and outdoor recreation areas

Businesses will be required to meet specific COVID-19 guidelines, including establishing a workplace specific plan, training employees, implementing screening and infection control measures, cleaning and disinfecting protocols and guidelines for social distancing best practices.
