Rehoming Your Pet

We know that the decision to rehome your pet is not an easy one to make. We are here to help you succeed at finding a great new home for your pet. He / She can go to a new home right from the home they have been used to and not have to come into the shelter which can be extremely stressful for some pets. In this packet, you will find helpful information for rehoming your pet.

Remind yourself that you are this pet's best option for finding a new home. You might think shelters or rescue groups would be more adept at placing the pet because we have experience, facilities, screening guidelines, etc. But, an individual, particularly one who knows the animal, can focus all his or her efforts on that pet, provide the most information to prospective adopters, and best determine the appropriateness of a new home. Also, any shelter or sanctuary is stressful for an animal. The shelter setting, no matter how nice, can bring on stress-related problems. Anxiety, aggression, and even illness are common, and these natural reactions may make adoption difficult or impossible.

We have a "Coordinated Intake" program. We encourage you to exhaust all other options before scheduling an owner surrender appointment with us.

- ✿ You may also post on your local social media pet groups. (For example, on Facebook: “Solano Best Pets and “Solano County Pets”). There are more city specific groups as well. Even try posting on your own personal page and see if family and friends would be willing to share the post.
- ✿ Check for local rescue groups in your area. Some can be breed specific and some can be all breeds and species. You can also check for rescues out of county and even out of state! If a rescue is unable to accept, ask if they’d be willing to post your pet’s profile on their social media on your behalf.
 - ✿ **If you have adopted the pet from a rescue, always contact them first.**
 - ✿ What is a rescue? An animal rescue group or animal rescue organization is dedicated to pet adoption. These groups assist pets by attempting to find suitable homes for them. Many rescue groups are a non-profit and created by/run by volunteers, who take animals into their homes and care for them – including training, playing, handling medical issues, and solving behavior problems – until a suitable permanent home can be found.

Creating An Ad For Your Pet

- You will need to get some good photos of your pet. Make sure the pictures are clear and you can see your pet's face and body.
 - Focus on your pet's personality. Think about what they love – whether that's sleeping, eating, or playing, try to capture a moment that represents what your pet is really like.
 - Take a lot of photos. Part of taking a great photo is persistence. Taking many photos will give you options to choose from.
 - Capturing a great video showcasing the pet's personality is highly encouraged.
- Write a nice, attention-grabbing description about your pet.
 - Make the first sentence interesting and portray the pet in a positive light. For example, if your pet is a dog who does not like cats, you don't want to start the sentence with that. Start it out with their happy attributes; maybe he loves to snuggle or play ball.
 - Focus on the pet's personality, their quirks, or the way they rest their head on your knee, etc.
 - When adding in "negative" information, make sure to watch the way you word it. For example, after you have said all the positive things, you could write "He loves to play with other dogs, but cars are just not for him".
 - Make sure to include name, age, spayed/neuter, microchipped, and medical information. (medical conditions, up to date on vaccines, allergies, etc.)
- At the end make sure to let the potential adopter know how they can meet your pet. Include your phone number or email so they can contact you directly.
- Use your own social media. You may have friends and family who would love to give your pet a new home.

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Proof of Rehoming Attempt

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is written by the Solano County Animal Care Services to show as proof of your tenant attempting to rehome their pet. Here at the shelter we are on a Coordinated Intake Program. We are proud to be on our way to reach a “no-kill” status, and to do this we are working hard to manage the space at our facility so that we may be a helpful resource to our community. This letter is to serve as our way of having you partner with us and to better understand our process.

Our rehoming process starts with a simple consultation in order to gather valuable information that we need. We ask the owners to post their pet on rehoming websites such as Facebook, Nextdoor, and Craigslist. We offer tools to make a desirable post, so the pet(s) have the best chance to find a new home. In the meantime, we have scheduled an appointment for surrendering if all other rehoming attempts are unsuccessful. This wait period can be potentially from a week to two months, depending upon availability and space. We thank you for helping us with our Coordinated Intake Program.

We understand the importance of rehoming this pet, since you do not allow them at your living facility. This letter is to serve as proof that your resident is working with us, following our process, and giving us the time we need in order to help as many pets as possible in our community.

If this is regarding a perceived breed, we would like to take this opportunity to explain that some dogs may appear to be a particular breed, but when DNA tests are done, they are not that breed at all, regardless of the way they look. We ask that you take the pets behavior history into consideration, instead of evaluating on the perceived breed. Another helpful tip for your tenant to keep their family pet would be to offer a pet deposit or have the renter look into pet insurance. These options can ease possible concerns for pet damage or liability.

Puppy Nipping

Our puppies do not have thumbs or hands, they interact with the world through their mouth! They use it for playing, eating, chewing, and exploring so we cannot stop them from putting things in their mouths, but we can help control what they do put in it. We want to minimize their opportunities to munch on fingers, toes, and limbs, and maximize their opportunities to interact with people appropriately, and finally, ensure they aren't learning to bite more.

Exercise and regular training games will be your best bet in preventing this unwanted behavior. A physically and mentally tired puppy is significantly less likely to bite or nip. To further prevent biting, limit their access to human limbs – puppies on couches and beds have easy targets for teeth, so you might want to prevent access to these surfaces while in training.

For maximizing opportunities to interact appropriately, make sure that interactions involve a toy between their mouth and your limbs. The more they practice interacting with you through toys, the less likely they will be to interact with your hands without them.

When they nip at us, we want to make sure we are not rewarding them by initiating play, giving attention, talking to them or anything else they might enjoy. We do not encourage punishing puppies, in fact we recommend avoiding that because we want to ensure they feel safe and secure around us. What we recommend instead is to ignore the biting. If they nip when you're on the couch, stand up so they can't continue to do so, and ignore them for 10-15 seconds. When you re-engage with your puppy, make sure you do so through a toy. Any attention, evening pushing them off, yelling at them, or spraying them with water can be interpreted as initiating play.

House Training

To house train your dog, you want to maximize their opportunities to go outside and minimize their opportunities to go inside.

To maximize opportunities to go outside we want to first look at common times when dogs have to urinate/defecate or use restroom:

- After eating
- After drinking
- Before going to bed
- After waking up in the morning
- After naps
- After playing
- After training
- When everyone gets up and moves to a new spot

Mostly any “transitional” period is a likely time when they might have to go to the bathroom, so be proactive and take them outside! By taking them out at these times they will get a lot of opportunities to be correct and use the bathroom in the right place.

Additionally, we want to minimize their opportunities to go inside. That could be things like managing them through keeping them on a leash when they wouldn't typically be supervised so they can't sneak off and urinate behind the couch. It could be crate training. It could also just be keeping an eye on them to watch for those signs that they are about to urinate, such as sniffing in circles, exploring the edges of the room, leaving the room, whining, or pacing.

Destructive Chewing

Just like with our puppy nipping problems, we can't really stop our dogs from putting things in their mouths, but we can help them build excellent habits of putting appropriate items in them! Chewing is essential for helping adult teeth come in, dental hygiene, and reducing boredom, so we want to make it as easy as possible for our dogs to chew appropriate items, and difficult for them to chew on inappropriate items.

You'll first want to puppy proof your home by keeping your shoes in closets, trash cans behind doors, and socks in the laundry hamper. When unsupervised, you might even want to prevent access to coffee table legs or couches by crating your dog, keeping them behind an exercise pen, or confined in another room. Make sure your dog has access to appropriate chew toys as well to build great habits of chewing on things you don't mind them destroying. Long lasting consumables like pig ears or bully sticks, or food puzzle toys like KONGs will keep them chewing and occupied for a while.

Since stress and boredom are common causes of destructive chewing, increasing the amount of physical and mental exercise your dog is getting can help alleviate these issues. More rigorous exercise and training will keep them exhausted and happy, and significantly less likely to chew inappropriately!

Resource Guarding

If your dog stares, growls, snaps, or does other concerning behaviors towards your family or other pets when they are eating or other resources like bones, toys, or any other object/person, then they might be resource guarding. We want to acknowledge that your dog is feeling threatened when they do this, and our goal should revolve around helping them feel less threatened. To do this we want to first set up an excellent management strategy to prevent your dog from feeling threatened. If they behave this way when eating their meals, feed them separately from your other pets and away from humans, either in another room or even crated. Let them leave the food bowl completely before removing the empty bowl. If your dog behaves this way with toys, you'll want to leave them alone when they are in possession of it. Often times, just leaving them alone when they have these resources, and feeding pets separately is sufficient to not encounter the problem, but by itself, these management strategies won't solve the resource guarding.

Separation Issues

It can be difficult to leave a dog at home that whines, barks, paces, urinates, or even destroys things when you're gone. Before calling it full blown separation anxiety, we want to look at what exactly our dogs are doing and see if there are ways to help them feel more comfortable being left alone. We first want to ensure that our dogs are properly house trained, are not being destructive out of boredom, and are getting plenty of exercise before we leave them alone. A dog who has their mental and physical needs met are usually more likely to sleep the day away when left alone.

If your dog is still having issues while they are getting plenty of exercise and house trained, then we next want to look at some management strategies to prevent them from feeling distressed or behaving poorly when alone. You can look into doggy daycare. Pet sitters, dog walkers, or even having a friend watch your dog during the day which can help your dog always have people around to prevent the problem from occurring. Sometimes, our dogs are happy having a friend at home to spend time with so go check out our adoptable animals for a potential friend! To further help our dogs feel better about us leaving them alone, give them a long-lasting consumable like a bully stick or pig ear, or a KONG filled with their food and peanut butter. This can keep them content and occupied while you are away. Another possible solution is crate training. A crate can give the dog a sense of a 'safe place'. Even draping a blanket or towel over the crate can give additional comfort. Check out more crate training tips on the following page.

Crate Training

Crate training your dog may take some time and effort but can be useful in a variety of situations. Crates can be used with new pets and for training purposes by limiting his/her access to the house until they learn all the house rules. It can be used for transporting a pet safely or for containment, at a place where he/she is not allowed to run freely. Also, a crate can be used to create a safe space for him/her to call their own. A crate should always be associated with something pleasant and training should be in a series of small steps; don't go too fast.

If you are not familiar with crate training, it is best to research this online as there are many different methods and you may want to pick and choose the best from the different recommendations.

Hiding or Fear (Dogs)

For dogs that feel afraid of things, whether it is strangers approaching on walks, new people coming to your house, loud noise, strange dogs, or even stairs, our goal should be to help them feel better around these things. We want to acknowledge that when our dog is growling at a person approaching or is even hesitant to pass through a doorway, they are feeling afraid and would benefit from either more space from the scary thing, or for the situation to be more fun and enjoyable. To help our dogs learn that scary things aren't as scary, we want to gradually introduce the trigger that causes the fear reaction at such a low level that it is hardly noticeable for our dog. At the same time, we want to condition them with high value treats, play, and fun while the trigger is present, so they learn the scary thing predicts fun things happening.

Now some dogs are more shut down and might choose to hide in a corner, in their crate, and try to avoid contact at all costs. For these dogs, we want to try to find something they like such as canned food, leftovers from dinner, or even a certain bone, and we want to just help them feel more comfortable. Giving them more space and opportunities to not interact, might help them overcome their fear of being in a new environment quicker compared to forcing them to interact. *Patience and reassurance is key.

Litter Box Issues

It can be weird to have a cat who has been successfully using their litter box their whole life and suddenly decides that right next to their litter box, or on top of your bed is the new best place to relieve themselves. This is a more common problem than you may think and most frequently happens when there has been a change in their life, such as moving to a new place, a new pet entering the house, changing the type of litter used, or even a medical concern. Since there could be a variety of reasons why your cat stopped using the litter box, you first want to get your cat checked out by their regular vet, and have them look for crystals or a UTI. These can cause going to the bathroom to be painful, and the litter box can then start to predict that pain, so your cat will begin to avoid that litter box.

Once your cat is medically clear, your goal should be to make going to the litter box as stress free as possible. You may need to increase the number of litter boxes, change the type of litter, scoop more frequently, move the litter box away from potentially loud or scary objects, or add more privacy such as a cover on the litter box or remove the existing cover. Usually playing around with these variables will make using the litterbox less stressful for your cat, and they will start using it regularly again!

*Adding a litter additive to the litter box is a great tool! You can find litter additives at any local store where pet supplies are sold.

Hiding (Cats)

A common issue people have with cats, especially after just bringing them home is that they spend all day hiding, and they only come out at night when you're asleep. It is typical for cats to hide when getting used to a new environment so it can take a little bit longer than we anticipate for them to become fully comfortable. To help them become more comfortable we want to strategically set up their environment so they can still "hide" but in more socially acceptable ways. Try blocking off the bottom of your sofa, under your bed, or any other tight places your cat likes to hide. Give them a more preferred place to hide such as on top of a cat tree, a crate you can keep out, a small cat bed on a bookshelf, or something similar that will give them privacy, but out where humans will be. To help these "hiding places" become a preferred place for your cat to be, hide food, catnip, or other high value treats and toys in those spots. For those cats that are only active at night, try making the daytime more nocturnal cat friendly by closing the blinds, turning off the lights, and limiting noise to encourage them to come out and explore more.
