

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF A DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (EIR) AND ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT (EA) FOR THE STATE ROUTE (SR) 37 FLOOD REDUCTION PROJECT (STATE CLEARINGHOUSE NO. 2021110045)



WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Calitrans) proposes to reduce flooding from stormwater overtopping and adapt to the projected 2130 sea level rise on SR 37 from Post Mile (PM) R11.2 to 13.8, in Marin County, California. The Project would replace the Novato Creek Bridge and construct a causeway at an elevation of 35 feet in 2 phases. The causeway would extend from U.S. 101 to Atherton Avenue.

Caltrans, as the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act and the National Environmental Policy Act, announced that the Draft Environmental Impact Report and Environmental Assessment for the proposed State Route (SR) 37 Flood Reduction Project is available for public review and comment. The document is available through this <u>link</u>.

The proposed Project would be constructed in two phases. • Phase 1: Caltrans would replace the Novato Creek bridge with a longer structure at the elevation of 35 feet, install two temporary transition bridge structures tied into existing grades, improve two existing local access roads, replace culverts, and regrade an existing drainage channel. Construction is anticipated to commence in 2027.

• Phase 2: Caltrans would construct the rest of the causeway from the 101/37 intersection to Atherton Avenue Undercrossing to an elevation of 35 feet. Caltrans proposes to remove the existing Simonds Slough Bridge, reconstruct the on and offramps at Hanna Ranch Road, Marsh Drive, and Atherton Avenue, install Type 85 barriers, and replace two culverts. Construction is anticipated to commence in 2041, subject to funding availability.

The Community Action Partnership Solano JPA is accepting applications for a Private Sector Representative to sit on the Tripartite Advisory Board (TAB).

The TAB meets quarterly and is responsible for assisting the Community Action Agency (CAP Solano JPA) in conducting a community needs assessment, clarifying the JPA's mission, supporting long-range strategic planning and annual planning, as well as assisting the JPA in implementing programs and evaluating the performance of JPA initiatives under CSBG funding.

The TAB is divided into three categories: The Public Sector is comprised of elected public officials currently holding office or their representatives. Solano County and its cities have partnered, again, with Solano Resource Conservation District to serve as the countywide coordinator for the 39th California Coastal Cleanup Day.

Supporting agencies throughout Solano County are hosting more than 60 cleanup sites for this event that takes place on **Saturday**, **September 23 from 9am to 12pm**. More than 2,500 local Solano volunteers participate in the countywide Coastal Cleanup Day events every year by converging at creeks, parks, open spaces, city trails and trash hot spots to remove thousands of plastic cigarette filters and thousands of pounds of plastic bottles, single use food containers and wrappers, grocery bags, and more.



City of Fairfield seeks applications for Measure P Oversight Committee

The City of Fairfield is accepting applications for two seats on the Measure P Oversight Committee. The unexpired term ends June 30, 2028. Applicants must be Fairfield residents and taxpayers. In November 2012, Fairfield voters passed Measure P, a one-cent transaction and use tax ordinance. In November 2016, Fairfield voters extended it through March 31, 2033. The ordinance directs the City Council to establish a five-member oversight committee to review



expenditures of revenues collected pursuant to the ordinance.


Vegetarian Diabetes Prevention Trial Program

STA Pedestrian Advisory Committee has open positions


The Solano Transportation Authority (STA) Pedestrian Advisory Committee is currently looking for members to represent the following:



Due to limited sworn police staffing, the Vallejo Police Department has been forced to reduce police services. VPD has determined that alarm calls have approximately a 98% rate of being unfounded. In an effort to provide efficient services to the community, the department is proposing to no longer respond to selected unverified alarm calls. This special-order directive does not exclude police response if the Watch Commander determines that response is necessary. The watch commander can direct field units dispatched to the event in accordance with standards.



Vallejo Kids' Book Fest



The Belle of Amherst


