State Commission approves Highway 37 toll proposal - reminder

As a reminder, in May the California Transportation Commission approved a plan to operate a toll facility on a stretch of Highway 37 between Mare Island in Vallejo and the junction with State Route 121 at Sears Point in Sonoma County.

Toll rates for regular two-axle cars and trucks traveling between Mare Island and Sears Point are expected to be similar to those on the Bay Area's state-owned toll bridges, which will rise to \$8 from the current \$7 in 2025. Tolls on Highway 37 may be collected in both the eastbound and westbound directions, in which case the toll rates would be set at just half those on the state-owned bridges, where tolls are collected only in one direction.

You can now get a ride to and from your doctor visits at no charge. As a Kaiser Permanente Medicare health plan member, you can get a ride to and from your appointments at no cost. Your plan covers up to 24 one-way trips (50 miles per trip) per calendar year.

To schedule a ride for rideshare, taxi, or private transportation service, call 1-877-930-1477 (TTY 711). You can also schedule online at medicaltrip.net or download the MTM Link Member app. To download the app on your device, visit the App Store (Apple) or Google Play (Android) and search for MTM Link Member App.

For wheelchair van or gurney van transportation service, call 1-833-226-6760.

Request your ride at least 3 business days (Monday through Friday) before your appointment. If you have an urgent last-minute appointment, call as soon as you can.

You can get rides for doctor appointments, medical services such as lab or X-ray, and picking up medications or medical equipment.


National Night Out registrations open

Fairfield releases water quality report



The City of Fairfield has released its 2022 Consumer Confidence Report, detailing the quality of tap water as it compares to State Water Resources Control Board and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency standards. The report includes details about where Fairfield's water comes from and what it contains.

Fairfield's drinking water is sourced from Lake Berryessa and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and is treated at the City's two water treatment plants – Waterman and North Bay Regional. Based on a series of tests, the quality of Fairfield's drinking water exceeds almost all industry standards.

What are the Possibilities for Benicia's North Side?



The North Study Area visioning process is a City-led effort resulting from an agreement with the property owner, including full cost recovery, to receive public comment and evaluate potential future use scenarios for the 527-acre parcel located near Lake Herman Road and East Second Street.

Informed by public comment, the City has evaluated key issues related to twelve topics in *The North Study Area Visioning Process Issues and Options* report, which is now available online at www.ci.benicia.ca.us/northstudyarea. Topics addressed in the report include land uses, fiscal sustainability, housing and traffic/circulation.

Moving forward, several alternative scenarios will be prepared for further analysis and public discussion. These scenarios will explore different ways to address many of the issues discussed in the report and identified in the questionnaire responses. The City's land economist, EPS (Economic and Planning Systems), will analyze the financial feasibility and fiscal impact of the scenarios. The scenarios and accompanying analysis will be available to the public for review in early Fall 2023.
