Those schools are the Vallejo Adult School at Al Berenguer Educational Center, Jesse Bethel High School, and Vallejo High School.

To receive such an honor, the schools must go through a rigorous process including an in-depth self-study, hosting a visit by fellow educators, and engaging all stakeholders in a follow-up process of implementing, monitoring, and refining the resulting schoolwide action plan. WASC accreditation validates the integrity of a school's program and assures a community that the school's goals are appropriate and accomplished through a viable education program.

State to launch BenefitsCal.com selfservice website in Solano County

The Solano County Department of Health and Social Services, Employment and Eligibility division, announced that on **Monday**, **July 3**, the State of California will launch the new BenefitsCal.com website in Solano County, giving customers who apply for and receive CalFresh, CalWORKs and Medi-Cal services, access to these benefits in a single online platform.

The state will begin migrating Solano County customers to the BenefitsCal.com platform starting on Thursday, June 29 at 2pm. During the transition, Solano County Employment and Eligibility (E&E) customers will not be able to access their accounts until the website launches on July 3 at 8am.

Solano County E&E offices will remain open during the transition to BenefitsCal.com, but services will be limited. Customers can visit and/or call a County E&E office with questions, including at 275 Beck Ave. in Fairfield, (707) 553-5000; 365 Tuolumne Street in Vallejo, (707) 784-8050; and 1119 E. Fairfield releases water quality report

The City of Fairfield has released its 2022 Consumer Confidence Report, detailing the quality of tap water as it compares to State Water Resources Control Board and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency standards. The report includes details about where Fairfield's water comes from and what it contains.

Fairfield's drinking water is sourced from Lake Berryessa and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and is treated at the City's two water treatment plants – Waterman and North Bay Regional. Based on a series of tests, the quality of Fairfield's drinking water exceeds almost all industry standards.

What are the Possibilities for Benicia's North Side?



The North Study Area visioning process is a City-led effort resulting from an agreement with the property owner, including full cost recovery, to receive public comment and evaluate potential future use scenarios for the 527-acre parcel located near Lake Herman Road and East Second Street.

Informed by public comment, the City has evaluated key issues related to twelve topics in *The North Study Area Visioning Process Issues and Options* report, which is now available online at www.ci.benicia.ca.us/northstudyarea. Topics addressed in the report include land uses, fiscal sustainability, housing and traffic/circulation.

Moving forward, several alternative scenarios will be prepared for further analysis and public discussion. These scenarios will explore different ways to address many of the issues discussed in the report and identified in the questionnaire responses. The City's land economist, EPS (Economic and Planning Systems), will analyze the financial feasibility and fiscal impact of the scenarios. The scenarios and accompanying analysis will be available to the public for review in early Fall 2023.

Updates from around Solano County

Fairfield to submit request for public assistance from FEMA for Lopes Road

Earlier this month, Solano County was added to the list of counties eligible for disaster related assistance. The City of Fairfield will submit a request for public assistance to receive financial support from the state and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) regarding repairing a water line along Lopes Road.

In mid-March, the hillside along Lopes Road failed, damaging a City of Benicia's water supply line and other underground utilities. Water has been restored through temporary water lines which must remain in place until permanent repairs can be made to the hillside, roadway, and underground utilities. All permanent repairs are dependent on existing soil conditions which are being assessed.

Summer reading program

Did you know?

Did you know that Solano Community College is now postured itself as the key player in biotechnology and biomanufacturing across the United States through its exemplary total education pathway from exposure of junior high students to a doctorate granting institutions? First, middle school and high school faculty have adding biotechnology concepts to their science course curriculum at local junior high and high schools through a partnership with SCC faculty. Once in high school, articulated high school classes flow seamlessly into three certificates and Solano's associate's degree in biotechnology. Of course, the AS degree flows seamlessly into the BS in Biomanufacturing degree at Solano. However, the summer IBIS program extends the promise of a BS degree by training students in related science fields in nine weeks allowing them to enter the program each fall. Next comes guaranteed admission to currently six advanced degrees granting institutions across the USA.

The pathway has multiple entry and exit points to enter industry. Another exceptional strategy has been and will continue

to be supporting our part-time students as every segment from certificate to BS degree can be pursued while students are employed. Jim DeKloe has given a presentation on this pathway to multiple audiences including the Community College League of California, the Community College Baccalaureate Association, the National Council for Workforce Education, and local audiences. Solano Community College continues to form close relationships with multiple university graduate programs.
