Traffic will be detoured around the closures. Eastbound traffic from Marin County may travel as far as SR-121 (Lakeville Highway). Westbound traffic from Solano County can travel as far as Walnut Avenue in Vallejo before diverting onto city streets.

Detour details:

- Motorists heading westbound will take Highway 29 to Highway 12, then take Highway 121/Arnold Drive to Highway 37.
- Motorists heading eastbound will take Highway 121/Arnold Drive to Highway 12, then Highway 29 to Highway 37.
 Westbound drivers may also continue on Highway 12 to Interstate 80.

Cycle 8 Participatory Budgeting (PB) vote underway



The city of Vallejo announced the Cycle 8 Participatory Budgeting vote will be held until June 30. Vallejo residents, including those living in the unincorporated areas, are invited to vote on which community projects to improve the city that will go to the Vallejo City Council for funding approval.

Residents are allowed to vote for up to two projects on the 10-proposal ballot. Projects are either

infrastructure (e.g., park updates, street safety improvements, etc.) and programs and services (e.g., youth programs, spay and neuter services, etc.)

Residents 14 years and older can vote online at www.pbvallejo.org, or in-person in City Hall, and a cell phone number and valid Vallejo address are required for online voting.

The tour allows residents the chance to interact with elected officials, meet department heads and staff, learn about city projects, and ask questions.



FAST changes

The city of Fairfield's transit service (FAST) will be increasing local fares by \$0.25 effective July 1 becoming the first fare increase for the transit agency since 2014.

FAST also announced that it will no longer be selling 31-day paper passes for fixed-route services effective July 1, however, paper passes purchased before July 1 may be used through December 31, 2023.

Passengers may still pay cash for their fare but will be encouraged to purchase their local pass using the regional Clipper Card payment system.

A paratransit DART fare will increase from \$3.50 to \$4.

For City Boards and Commissions, except for the Beautification, Civil Service, Human Relations, McCune Collection, and Sister City Commissions, and the Participatory Budgeting Steering Committee, all appointed members must complete and file a Statement of Economic Interests, Form 700, within 30 days of appointment. All City Board and Commission members must complete AB 1234 Ethics training and file a Certificate of Completion within 30 days of appointment.

In most instances, to be eligible for appointment, applicants must be residents of the City of Vallejo. Information regarding the duties of each board and commission and specific criteria for appointment may be found within each application. With some exceptions, appointments are typically for a term of 4 years.

The application period will close on Wednesday, May 31st, at 5 pm.

No appointment is necessary however, proof of residency is required. Master Gardeners from the UCCE Solano will be onsite to provide residents with information about compost uses and other horticultural tips and tricks.

The compost will be delivered in bulk and residents are asked to bring their own containers to fill up and take home; each household is limited to 30 gallons of compost. This is a self-serve event, but shovels and gloves will be provided for use.

According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), one in five American adults live with a mental illness with suicide being the leading cause of death in the United States. —To honor Mental Health Awareness Month, the Solano County Department of Health and Social Services, Behavioral Health division, in partnership with Solano County Library Services will host two free, family-friendly comedy shows for the public to explore stigma and its impact on mental illness and suicide.

The event will allow residents to remove trash debris, plant wildflower plugs, create take-home seed packets, and participate in other group and family-friendly activities including kayak tours of Lake Solano.

A free lunch will be served to all participants, who should wear sturdy shoes, work gloves, and sun protection.

Lake Solano County Park, approximately 4 miles west of Winters, CA, on Pleasants Valley Road just south of Highway 128. Volunteers that choose to assist with trash cleanup activities will cleanup at Lake Berryessa and Lake Solano. Parking fees will be waived with a pass provided to event registrants in advance.

This water is also the primary source of irrigation water for growers in the region. Also filling and leaving Lake Solano is Putah Creek, a vital ecological link between the neighboring mountain range and the Yolo Bypass.
