

Change Your Clocks and Check Your Smoke Alarm Batteries



Remember to move your clocks back one hour on Sunday, November 5! Take the opportunity to change your smoke alarm batteries. Smoke alarms with non-replaceable 10-year batteries are designed to remain effective for up to 10 years. If the alarm chirps, warning that the battery is low, replace the entire smoke alarm right away. Smoke alarms with any other type of battery need a new battery at least once a year. If that alarm chirps, warning the battery

is low, replace the battery right away. When replacing a battery, follow the manufacturer's list of batteries on the back of the alarm or manufacturer's instructions. Manufacturer's instructions are specific to the batteries (brand and model) that must be used. The smoke alarm may not work properly if a different kind of battery is used.

Unpaid Tolls and Penalties in the Bay Area? Find Solutions Here!



The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has notified Housing Authorities to alert low-income families about the Bay Area Toll Payment Plan initiated by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) and Bay Area Toll Authority (BATA) in August.

This plan will aid eligible individuals in settling outstanding toll debt, preventing DMV holds on vehicle registration. In addition, penalty waivers are available to all drivers. The Bay Area Toll Payment Plan is accessible to drivers who have used Bay Area bridges or express lanes and owe at least \$100 in tolls, violation penalties, and DMV fees after any applied waivers.

Federal Funding Account Objection Period Notice

The Objection Period for the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Federal Funding Account's first application window opened on Monday, October 23 and will close on **November 20, 2023, at 5**

p.m. Pacific Standard Time. The Federal Funding Account's main webpage will display a link to the <u>Broadband Grant Portal's</u> Objection page.

During the Objection Period, interested parties may review Federal Funding Account application project summaries and submit objections. An objection must meet the criteria in <u>Decision 22-04-055</u>, Appendix A, section 12, including identifying and discussing errors of fact, policy, or statutory requirements that the application has contravened.

Responses to objections are due at 5 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, 28 days from the service date of any objection. Responses to objections should provide evidence refuting the objection, including identifying and discussing errors of fact, policy, or statutory requirements in the objection.

All objections and responses must be made through the <u>Broadband Grant Portal</u>, which will serve notice of the objection or response to the California Advance Services Fund distribution list. Interested entities should consider adding the Broadband Grant Portal email, <u>noreply@salesforce.com</u>, to their safe senders list.

An objection or response made outside the Broadband Grant Portal or after the deadline will not be considered. Further information on the objection process is available in the Federal Funding Account's <u>Administration Manual</u>. Instructions on how to use the Portal are available in the Broadband Portal User Guide.

Medicare Open Enrollment

From now until December 7, those already enrolled in Medicare can make changes to their current health plan and those who now qualify can enroll. Existing health and drug plans can make

changes to their cost, coverage, and provider/pharmacy network each year, so it's important to review which plans best fit your needs.

If you make less than \$22,000 per year (\$30,000 for married couples), you may qualify for "Medicare Part D Extra Help." This program could cut your Medicare Part D drug costs to no more than \$4.15 for generic prescriptions and \$10.35 for brand-name drug prescriptions.

Faster Freeways – Exploring the Potential of Pricing

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission will conduct a <u>public</u> webinar as part of the Next Generation Bay Area Freeways Study,

which seeks to better understand the feasibility of all-lane tolling on freeways with robust parallel transit in 2035.

The webinar will present two future scenarios of the Bay Area – one with freeway pricing, and one without. Participants will then weigh in on the tradeoffs between those two scenarios and provide feedback on potential pricing strategies and complementary strategies that could be funded with freeway toll revenue.

Implementation Working Group (IWG) Plenary Meeting for Building Appliances

BAY AREA AIR QUALITY On March 15, 2023, the Bay Area Air MANAGEMENT DISTRICT Quality Management District adopted amendments to Rule 9-4: Nitrogen Oxides from Fan Type Residential Central Furnaces and Rule 9-6: Nitrogen Oxides Emissions from Natural Gas-Fired Boilers and Water Heaters. These rules govern point of sale emission standards for small, typically residential and commercial, water and space heating systems.

Space and water-heating appliances generate a large portion of nitrogen oxide (NOx) emissions from sources in the Bay Area. NOx is formed during natural gas combustion when ambient nitrogen and oxygen combine at high temperatures. The amendments will substantially reduce NOx emissions from these appliances and therefore secondary particulate matter formation. The implementation of these rule amendments will be a multiyear effort, spanning from 2024 to 2031.

As part of the amendments, the Air District has convened the Implementation Working Group (IWG). The IWG is comprised of over 40 invited stakeholders representing a variety of stakeholder

segments. The purpose of the IWG is to provide input to Air District staff's periodic reports to the Board of Directors on the implementation of the Building Appliances Rules and to provide the Air District staff with insights on the technical readiness of the market and equitable transition to compliant appliances, so as to not unduly burden any income class or professional group. As such, the IWG provides a forum for invited members to discuss technical and equity aspects of implementing the Building Appliances Rules.

The third IWG plenary meeting will take place on **Tuesday**, **November 7 from 1 to 4pm** virtually via Zoom. Members of the public may attend in listen-only mode with the opportunity to provide public comments at the end of the meeting. To attend the meeting please <u>use this link</u>.

The city of Benicia began the process of updating the 1997 Parks, Trails and Open Space Master Plan in 2021. After extensive community input, the Parks and Community Services Department has completed a draft of the Master Plan for public review.


The document is in its final form regarding recommendations provided by the community for improvements to the parks, trails and open space system. The draft was presented to the Parks, Recreation, and

Cemetery Commission on Oct. 18, 2023, at which time public input on the draft was welcomed.

Updates from around Solano County

City closer to selecting engineering firm for Lopes Road Project



In mid-March, the hillside west of Lopes Road became saturated from the series of winter rainstorms, causing a failure that affected the city of Benicia's water supply line and other underground utilities. The city of Fairfield is partnering with Benicia to receive financial support through public assistance grants. Both cities are also working to ensure that the restoration is completed in the most efficient and cost-effective manner.

In August, Fairfield requested a proposal soliciting design and engineering services to restore the Lopes Road hillside, roadway, and underground utilities and received two proposals in September, both of which were evaluated by staff from both cities. Staff is currently awaiting approval from both city councils in December.



In-Person IHSS Career Pathways courses in Solano County


Daily homecare providers will have a chance to attend free trainings at Solano Community College from November 14 to November 30.


