

Join me in honoring longtime Fairfield Mayor Harry Price.

The public is invited to attend the Harry T. Price memorial Council Chamber dedication on **Tuesday, November 21 at 5:30pm**. The dedication will take place in the quad in front of the Council Chamber located at 1000 Webster Street in Fairfield.

Harry T. Price began his life of service in Fairfield in 1965 as a teacher at Vanden High School. In 1992, he was appointed to the Fairfield Planning Commission. Five years later, in 1997, he was elected to the Fairfield City Council. He became Mayor in 2005 and held that title until his passing in 2022.

He was a beloved family man and mentor and is a prominent figure in Fairfield's history.

Solano County officials invite residents to help plan the potential future of Benicia Road in the city of Vallejo by participating in a three-day design workshop to help provide a clear, community-supported vision for the area.

#### The three-day Benicia Road Design Workshop from Thursday, December 7 to Saturday, December 9 will be held at Second Baptist Church, 1170 Benicia Road.

There will be an open house and initial presentation on **Thursday**, **December 7**.

The open house drop-in will begin at 6pm and will allow residents to share ideas for a safer and more walkable neighborhood along Benicia Road. Questions include: What types and scale of housing would support residents of all ages and incomes? What improvements are needed to attract neighborhood supporting businesses? How do we make Benicia Road greener and more sustainable?

The initial presentation will start at 7pm, allowing residents to hear an overview from Solano County Planning about this three-day workshop intended to bring you together with designers, builders, and architects to design-test creative and practical ideas to shape the potential future of Benicia Road.

**On Friday, December 8**, there will be an open house drop-in from 6 to 7:30pm. View initial sketches drawn from the ideas shared at Thursday's open house and provide feedback.

**Finally, on Saturday, December 9**, there will be a summary presentation from 6 to 7:30pm. Come see how two days of

community input guided the final design proposal. Potential outcomes could include changes in building design standards, street

improvements, or alternative zoning for land uses to support future housing and retail shops.

# MTC/ABAG-Backed ACA 1 goes before the voters in 2024



MTC/ABAGbacked <u>Assembly</u> <u>Constitutional Amendment</u> <u>1</u> which would lower the vote threshold for local special taxes and bonds to fund affordable housing, transportation, resilience

and other public infrastructure projects from two-thirds to 55%, will go to voters in November 2024.

The state Legislature last month approved sending the amendment, authored by Assemblymember Cecilia Aguiar-Curry, to voters with the backing of the entire Bay Area legislative delegation.

Similar bills have been proposed over the past two decades but until now none were approved by the house of origin, a hurdle that itself requires a two-thirds vote. Other supporters included Nonprofit Housing Association of Northern California, Enterprise Community Partners, the California Professional Firefighters, and individual cities and counties.

The Bay Area is preparing to place a regional housing bond on the November 2024 ballot, with 80% of funds flowing to counties and several large cities and 20% designated for regionwide programs administered by the <u>Bay Area Housing Finance</u> <u>Authority</u> (BAHFA).

### Ag Department progressing toward invasive pest eradication in Vacaville neighborhood



The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) is renewing an emergency proclamation for eradication of the glassywinged sharpshooter in Vacaville, Solano County officials announced this week.

Solano County Agricultural Biologists identified

the glassy-winged sharpshooter infestation in the Browns Valley neighborhood during a routine invasive pest survey in October 2021. Since then, the Solano County Agriculture Department has made progress toward eliminating the pest but requires more time to achieve complete eradication.

Agricultural Biologists have found 138 adult sharpshooters and over 500 egg masses in Browns Valley. The infestation remains confined to the originally defined quarantine boundary which encompasses 3,500 acres around Browns Valley. CDFA and the County Agriculture Department will be hosting a public meeting on December 6<sup>th</sup> to provide an update on the eradication project. To register for the meeting please

Glassy-winged sharpshooters are invasive pests of special concern because they vector the bacterium *Xylella fastidiosa*, which causes the deadly Pierce's disease in grapevines. Because there is no known cure for Pierce's disease, glassy-winged sharpshooters present an imminent danger to Solano vineyards and California's grape growing regions. A previous Vacaville glassy-winged sharpshooter infestation was successfully eradicated in 2007.

# Solano Public Health receives grant for car seat safety education program

– The Solano County Health & Social Services Department, Public Health Division has received a \$118,614 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) to continue its child passenger safety efforts in Solano County, officials announced this week. The increased funding from the OTS will continue to support the various program services offered by the Solano Car Seat Connection Program, which works closely with parents and caregivers on teaching proper car seat use and safe installation. Grant funds will support car seat safety classes, individual car seat inspection appointments, and community-wide car seat checkup events.

The Solano Car Seat Connection Program currently offers virtual car seat safety classes in both live and self-guided formats. The classes assist parents in getting a firm understanding of best practices for car seat safety. The classes also educate parents and caregivers on current car seat safety laws in California, such as keeping children under the age of 2 in a rear-facing car seat unless they weigh 40 pounds or more or are 40 inches or taller in height.

The Solano Car Seat Connection Program also supports the community of Solano with individualized car seat inspection appointments conducted by Certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians. All the program's services are provided in both English and Spanish.

### **Medicare Open Enrollment**

**From now until December 7**, those already enrolled in Medicare can make changes to their current health plan and those who now qualify can enroll. Existing health and drug plans can make changes to their cost, coverage, and provider/pharmacy network each year, so it's important to review which plans best fit your needs.

If you make less than \$22,000 per year (\$30,000 for married couples), you may qualify for "Medicare Part D Extra Help." This program could cut your Medicare Part D drug costs to no more than \$4.15 for generic prescriptions and \$10.35 for brand-name drug prescriptions.

### Need a ride to the doctor?

You can now get a ride to and from your doctor visits at no charge As a Kaiser Permanente Medicare health plan member, you can get a ride to and from your appointments at no cost. Your plan covers up to 24 one-way trips (50 miles per trip) per calendar year.

To schedule a ride for rideshare, taxi, or private transportation service, call 1-877-930-1477 (TTY 711). You can also schedule online at medicaltrip.net or download the MTM Link Member app. To download the app on your device, visit the App Store (Apple) or Google Play (Android) and search for MTM Link Member App.

For wheelchair van or gurney van transportation service, call 1-833-226-6760.

Request your ride at least 3 business days (Monday through Friday) before your appointment. If you have an urgent last-minute appointment, call as soon as you can.

You can get rides for doctor appointments, medical services such as lab or X-ray, and picking up medications or medical equipment. This benefit is limited to Kaiser Medicare members who had coverage through an employer or who were also on Medi-Cal.

### New Comment Opportunity: Support Policy to Stop Cuts in SSI Benefits

The Social Security Administration (SSA) published a proposed regulation in September that would allow more disabled people and older adults to get full Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments each month.

SSI provides lifesaving income supports, but people can see their benefits cut by a third if they get help paying for housing and other necessities. SSA's proposed regulation would stop cuts to people's SSI checks if their household receives SNAP benefits (food stamps).


This is important for recipients because, with a maximum SSI benefit of just \$914 per month, with benefits often reduced because of other income, virtually all SSI recipients are struggling financially.

The proposed regulation would also make the SSI program work better for everyone. There would be less onerous reporting requirements for SSI applicants and recipients and thousands of hours of less work for the already overstretched SSA staff.

### Benicia Parks, Trails, Open Space Master Plan



The city of Benicia began the process of updating the 1997 Parks, Trails and Open Space Master Plan in 2021. After extensive community input, the Parks and Community Services Department has completed a draft of the Master Plan for public review.

The document is in its final form regarding recommendations provided by the community for improvements to the parks, trails and open space system. The draft was presented to the Parks, Recreation, and Cemetery Commission on Oct. 18, 2023, at


which time public input on the draft was welcomed.


Broken streetlight? Abandoned vehicle? Report it by using the MyFairfieldCA app.





ceremony include family entertainment, hot latkes, donuts, and Chanukah cookies.


