## T-7 - Management of Suspected Open Book Pelvic Fracture

This protocol is NOT to be used for a simple isolated hip fracture!

Evaluate Mechanism of Injury for possible open book pelvic fracture:

- 1. Does the Mechanism of injury suggest a significant amount of energy transfer such as:
- --Multiple roll-over accident
- --Auto versus pedestrian
- --Fall from a height greater than 15 feet.
- 2. History: Does the patient complain of:
- --lower abdominal pain,
- --lower back pain,
- --hip or pelvic pain,
- --lower extremity numbness or tingling?

If patient unconscious, assume YES to this question.

- 3. Physical Exam: On palpation, does the patient have:
- --pelvic ring instability,
- --movement of the pelvic bones,
- --deformity or
- --crepitus?

If the answer is YES to ALL 3 questions, then:

Apply Solano County approved pelvic binder device and transport patient to trauma center.

Disrupted Communications: In the event of a "disrupted communications" situation, the EMT-P in Solano County may utilize all portions of this treatment protocols without Base Hospital Contact as is needed to stabilize an immediate patient.
