Subject: Significant Issues Update

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### **1) County Administrator's Update on Contracts**

The County Administrator signed the following contracts of significance since the last Significant Issues update:

- Human Resources, a contract with Employee Relations, Inc. to provide background and reference checks, \$49,999, from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2018.
- Human Resources, a contract with Phase II Systems to provide PARS trust administration services, including performing monthly accounting of PARS Plan assets, monitoring the receipt of Plan contributions made by the County to the PARS Trust Program trustee and developing Retirement Enhancement Plan annual contribution rates, \$48,000 from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2017.

### **2) Vallejo City Unified School District and the Workforce Investment Board (WIB) of Solano County Partner to Employ Vallejo's Youth this Summer**

High school students find themselves with extra time on their hands and looking for summer jobs. To help Vallejo high school students find those summer employment opportunities, the Workforce Investment Board (WIB) of Solano County has partnered with the Vallejo City Unified School District (VCUSD) in launching their "Putting Our Youth to Work" program. The WIB has helped VCUSD conduct work-readiness workshops for students, and find local businesses willing to provide the eight week paid summer internships.

The goals of the "Putting Our Youth to Work" are to provide summer jobs for Vallejo's youth, prepare them for the workplace, and help them identify career pathways and possible future employers. The program runs from the end of June through the middle of August, providing up to 150 students with the work experience and job skills needed to succeed upon entering the workforce.

The WIB of Solano County and VCUSD's work-readiness workshops were designed to provide students with the information and expectations of what it would take to become a successful employee this summer. The workshops focused on developing the soft skills needed in the workplace such as communication, problem solving, critical thinking, professionalism, networking, and teamwork. Over seventy students participated in three workshops throughout Vallejo last month.

The "Putting Our Youth to Work" program has placed 120 students in paid internships for the summer, and received commitments from Kaiser Permanente and other local businesses to participate in the program. The WIB of Solano County and VCUSD have successfully partnered to help employ Vallejo's youth today and prepare them for tomorrow's workforce.

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### **3) Update: Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) / California Water Fix Proposal Project**

The revised set of environmental documents for the Bay Delta Conservation Plan/California Water Fix proposed project was released on July 10, 2015. The documents are a combination state-federal Partially Recirculated Draft Environmental Impact Report and a Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement. The document is intended to update and partially supplant the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) draft environmental document released in December 2013. The new documents reflect a revised twin tunnels project only. The proposed project no longer includes the Natural Community Conservation Plan (NCCP) and federal Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) components found in the 2013 document.

The comment period for review of the environmental document closes on August 31, 2015. There will be two public meetings July 28 (Sacramento) and July 29, 2015 (Walnut Grove). The revised and updated documents can be found at many libraries throughout the region and at the following website:
