t-8 EYE INJURIES

PRIORITIES:

- ➤ ABCs
- > Treat life threatening injuries first
- ➤ Look for underlying injuries;
- > Determine if patient's injury(s), history, mechanism of injury requires "LOAD AND GO" activities.
- > Assure an advanced life support response.
- Administer oxygen to patients with eye injuries

Chemical Burns (Acid or Alkali)

- 1. Immediately irrigate profusely with water or normal saline (at least two liters0 on all chemical injuries (Check for and remove contacts)
- 2. Assess and monitor respiratory status for possible inhalation exposure of noxious fumes or chemicals
- 3. Avoid contaminating the other eye
- 4. Care should be taken to avoid self contamination.

Eye Trauma

- 1. Cover both eyes loosely with no pressure to the globe;
- 2. Position patient sitting up, if comfortable.
- 3. Impaled objects should be stabilized and NOT removed.
- 4. If foreign bodies are embedded in the eye, cover BOTH eyes.
- 5. Assess for potential head and/or C-spine injury if mechanism of injury exists.
