Re: People v. Eric Rogers - FCR334209

Today, in Department 4 of the Solano County Superior Court, before the Honorable Judge Ramona Garrett, the jury found the defendant, Eric Rogers, guilty of a Felony, Inflicting Corporal Injury on a Former Dating Partner, in violation of Penal Code section 273.5(a), and of two counts of misdemeanor Vandalism. On September 9, 2017, the defendant who had previously been convicted of a felony and was currently on Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS), shattered a victim's vehicle window in the city of Vacaville. Two months later, Defendant shattered the bedroom window of his ex-girlfriend. Three days later, on November 20, 2017, he struck his ex-girlfriend in the face causing a gash to the bridge of her nose and subsequent bruising to her nose and face. The victim still suffers from breathing issues due to the assault.



The jury found true the allegation that Defendant was previously convicted of a felony offense that resulted in a prison sentence. The Judge further found that Defendant was in violation of his Post-Release Community Supervision in Case Number FCR323766. The defendant is in custody without bail and is scheduled to be sentenced on April 23, 2018, at 8:30 a.m. in Department 4.

Vacaville Police Department Officers Perkins, Eisert, Moore, and Detective McCoy, investigated the case. The case was prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney William Moser.
