**COVID NUMBERS AND VACCINES**

Our Covid numbers have shown improvement. Our positivity rate has gone down quite a bit and all other indicators show we have turned a corner. Tuesday June 15<sup>th</sup> will be the date that most virus restrictions are lifted, and the state will be mostly reopened.

However, the state and the county will continue their respective emergency declarations. The virus is still present and maintaining these declarations will allow us to continue to respond to the constantly evolving situation.

With the reopening of the state on June 15<sup>th</sup>, we will see the end of most mask requirements for those who are vaccinated. Schools, healthcare settings, public transit, indoor school classes, homeless shelters and cooling centers will still require masks. There are also still CAL-OSHA requirements on wearing masks at work that have been changed twice very recently. Also, private businesses may require anyone entering their business to wear masks. Personally, I plan to continue wearing my mask for the foreseeable future. The virus is still spreading, and this is the decision I feel most comfortable with.

The most effective way to stop the spread of this virus continues to be vaccination. While nearly 2/3 of eligible Solano residents have received at least one vaccine, we need to get more people vaccinated. If enough people are vaccinated, the virus will no longer be able to spread. Please get vaccinated if you have not already. Please encourage everyone you know to get vaccinated.

There will be a second dose clinic at the Norman King Center in south Vallejo this Sunday from 1-4. The J&J vaccine will be available for those who have not yet been vaccinated. You will also be able to get your first dose of Pfizer as well. The county can arrange for you to get your second dose.

**SCHOOL FUNDING FROM COVID RELIEF PACKAGES**

Here is a breakdown of how much money the schools in Solano County are receiving or have received from the covid relief packages. Congressmemnber Mike Thompson’s office provide me this information from Ed Source.

Some of the charter schools receiving much smaller amounts (such as Vallejo Charter School) are dependent charter schools. This means the charter school is operated and staffed by the local school district.
