Honoring Tom Bradley



This first Friday in February, I want to honor Thomas Bradley. Tom, the grandson of a slave, attended UCLA on an athletic scholarship where he ran track and played football. In 1940 he joined the

police academy. While working as a police officer, he attended Southwestern Law School in Los Angeles. He rose to the rank of Lieutenant and after 21 years as a police officer, he retired and began practicing law. In 1963 he ran for LA city council. He won, becoming the first Black person to serve on the council. Perhaps most importantly, he was the first Black mayor of Los Angeles. He served for 20 years (5 terms). He ran for California Governor in 1982 and 1986 but lost to George Deukmejian both times. The 1982 loss coined the political term "the Bradley effect" (to which I leave the research on what this means to you, the reader).

Today, his legacy is still felt. LAX is named for him. The International Terminal was dedicated on June 11, 1984. The 23rd Olympic Games were held in LA that July so many saw his name. As Mayor he worked to get the funding to expand the airport. When I fly into

LAX, I think of him and what he accomplished. I do wish he had become our governor.



Tuesday night I attended the workshop on Fentanyl put on by the Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District. The event was held at the Public Safety Academy. Here is just one statistic: more than 100,000 died last year of an overdose in the U.S. Two-thirds of those fatalities were due to fentanyl. To learn more visit, VibeSolano.com. The discussion also included the use of Narcan in helping to prevent overdoses.

Wednesday I was invited to attend a lunch time debate with the Benicia High School debate team. The topic was "should football teams be allowed on high schools?" At least 50 students attended and the two debate teams did a great job. They did not change my mind as I love football, but the arguments used on the pro/con side were thoughtful.
