SNAP hot food waiver



In response to the recent storms and flooding in California, the Department of Social Services and Food and Nutrition Services has approved a hot food waiver for SNAP EBT recipients in select counties through February 20, 2023, effective immediately. Solano County is included under this waiver. The waiver qualifies purchases of hot, pre-prepared foods from SNAP authorized retailers like grocery stores. What it means if you see a negative balance on your middle-class tax refund debit card

Have you noticed a negative balance on your tax refund debit card? It's caused by common issues like internet connection problems or technical glitches that can then misrepresent your balance, KCRA reports. If there's a negative balance on your card, California's Franchise Tax Board says there's no need to pay it back.

How to keep your kitchen compost pail clean

- Wash the pail regularly with soap and water.
- Sprinkle baking soda into the pail to reduce odors.
- Line the pail with newspaper, a paper bag, or a BPI certified compostable bag. Options available online and at local retailers.

3. Women's Recovery Response: 2023-2024 Grant Funding Opportunity

This is the second round of grant funds administered by the Commission and is available on a rolling basis through fiscal year 2023-2024.
