Originally called "<u>Decoration Day</u>," Memorial Day dates back to the 1860s and commemorates those who died while serving in the U.S. Civil War, which

ended in 1865. In the years following, Americans paid tribute to soldiers by <u>decorating</u> their graves and saying prayers, according to the History Channel. Following World War I, it was changed to Memorial Day to honor American soldiers who died in any war. In 1971, Congress moved Memorial Day and a number of federal holidays to Mondays. The change was designed to schedule certain holidays so that workers had a number of long weekends throughout the year,

# Solano County challenges youth to fight fentanyl with 'One Pill Can Kill' video contest

Building on Solano County's campaign to inform the public about high overdose rates and the growing dangers of fentanyl cloaked as prescription drugs, Solano Public Health has launched its first "One Pill Can Kill" Video Contest. This initiative invites Solano County youth to create compelling videos that raise awareness of the risks of fentanyl-laced pills and promote healthier choices. Winning high school and college students can earn up to \$1,500 for their efforts.



"This contest is a creative way for young people to have fun, spread the word—and maybe even save a life," says Robin Cox, MPH, CPH, Solano County's Health Promotion & Community Wellness (VibeSolano) Bureau Chief. "Knowing the source of any pill taken is critical to prevent an overdose. Teens may take street pills thinking they're Oxycodone, Adderall or Xanax, risking potential death if they are counterfeits laced with fentanyl."

# African American County Supervisors meet up at California State Assocation of Counties (CSAC)

Supervisor Wiliams served as the keynote speaker for a reception hosted by the League of California Cities African American Caucus and the Black Elected Officials of California. Held last month at the CSAC Convention in Sacramento, a large contingency of elected and appointed officials attended the event.





Supervisor Williams previously served on the Board of the League of Cities' African American Caucus during her service as a member of the Suisun City Council.

The reception helped close out the CSAC Conference where more than 400 county supervisors, Chief Administrative Officers (CAOs), department heads, and other leaders, representing the State's 58 counties, convened in Sacramento County

last week for the 2024 CSAC Legislative Conference to amplify the collective voices of California's Counties in the State Capitol. The conference was hosted concurrently with the League of California Cities annual legislative conference to bring together the shared priorities of local leaders from both the city and county level to Sacramento.

# CELEBRATE WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY: VOLUNTEER AT LAKE SOLANO

On Saturday, June 1st, Volunteers are invited to celebrate World Environment Day at Lake Solano County Park to learn about the Lake Berryessa and Putah Creek watersheds, remove trash debris collecting along waterways that serve as drinking and irrigation water for Solano County, plant wildflower seeds, create take-home seed packets, and participate in other group and family-friendly activities including a kayak



tour of Lake Solano. A free lunch will be served to all participants. Registration is required and can be completed at <u>cleanupsolano.org</u> under the World Environment Day tab. Participants should wear sturdy shoes, work gloves, and sun protection. Parking fees will be waived with a pass provided to event registrants in advance.

# U.S. Department of Transportation awards infrastructure grant to prevent flooding of Highway 37

This funding is just one part of a comprehensive, regional project by the Bay Area counties and Caltrans to rebuild Highway 37 and keep it safe for commuters.

### County selects new probation chief



Dean Farrah has been selected as Chief Probation Officer for Solano County. He was selected after a nationwide recruitment by the Solano County Superior Court, in coordination with Solano County Board of Supervisors. Farrah, who has been serving as the department's Interim Chief of Probation for the past six months, assumed the new role on April 28, 2024.

"The judges of the Solano County Superior Court are unanimous in their belief that Dean Farrah is extraordinarily well-qualified to serve as our next Chief Probation Officer," said Alicia Jones, Presiding Judge, Solano County Superior Court. "He has worked as a probation professional for nearly three decades, and we look forward to his leadership in working with the Court, the County, and the community in coordinating services

and programs for adult and juvenile offenders to encourage rehabilitation and reduce recidivism."

As Chief Probation Officer, Farrah will provide leadership, direction, and oversight to a department of 228 employees, the administration of a \$55 million-dollar annual operating budget, and assume responsibility for all juvenile and institutional operations, including field and court programming. As part of his role in the community, Farrah will serve as Chair of the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council and the Community Corrections Partnership, and as a member of the Solano County Law Enforcement Administrators Association.

Farrah was hired to serve as the Superintendent / Division Chief of the Probation Department's Juvenile Detention Facility for the Solano County Department of Probation in 2016. He was promoted to Chief Deputy Probation Officer in 2021 where he served in the role for two years. In July 2023, Farrah was appointed as the Interim Chief Probation Officer when Christopher Hansen, the former Chief of Probation retired. Since then, Farrah has been managing all department operations, including the coordination and direction of all Probation-related activities with the Courts and County administration.

#### **Answers to This Month's Fun Fact:**

As a result of the passage of <u>Proposition 103</u> in 1988, the elected office of the California Insurance Commissioner was created in 1991. Previously, the position was held by a person appointed by the Governor. The ballot measure required insurers "roll back" their rates 20 percent. Proposition 103 devised a process enabling

consumer participation in the setting of insurance rates, and allowed consumer "intervenors" witness fees and expenses in some cases.

John Garamendi, now United States Congressman, 8th District, was the first person ever elected by voters to serve as Insurance Commissioner for California. He held the seat from 1991 to 1995. .
