

#### Status of Grants

**Great news! The Airport received word last** week of approval of a grant in the amount of \$281,822 to update the Airport Layout Plan (ALP). ALPs are a set of drawings that lay out existing facilities as well as future development at the Airport. The FAA only funds projects depicted on the ALP, so it is a critical and necessary document for receiving federal grants. The FAA also uses it as a tool to monitor the airport's compliance with design standards and grant assurances. ALPs are typically updated every 5 to 10 years. Last updated in 2014, the new ALP will enable the Airport to continue to receive funding for future projects.

Status of Electrical Assessment Study grant project: Mead & Hunt, the consulting firm heading up the project, is scheduled to be at the Airport between November 13<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> assessing the runway lighting. Staff expects minimal impact to air operations, but the runway may be closed for a few hours early in the day while the work is completed. More information will be sent out as the project date nears.
