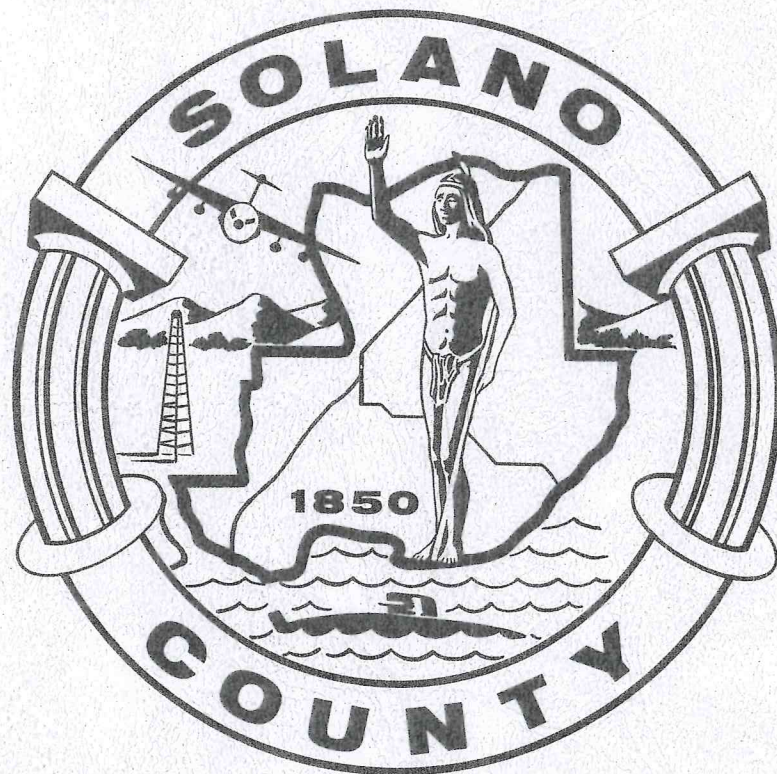


AGRICULTURAL CROP REPORT 1984

In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual crop report of agricultural production for the year 1984. This report addresses the acreage, production, and gross value of agricultural production in Solano County and does not reflect any net values.

The gross value of all agricultural products for 1984 was \$140,629,900, up \$4,169,300 from 1983. This rise in gross value is due to increased production in fruit and nut crops recovering from the wet spring of 1983, increased seed acreage, and increased acreage of asparagus, tomatoes, bell peppers, and sweet corn. In addition numerous idled acres through the PIK (Payment-in-Kind) Program were returned to production. In 1983 there was a total of 22,739 acres of wheat and corn idled by the PIK Program. Subsequently, in 1984 there was only 3,290 acres involved in the PIK Program. This is part of the explanation for an increase in gross value despite overall declining agricultural income.

Tomatoes was the leading crop in 1984 in gross value at \$21,492,700, which is an increase of \$1,532,700 over 1983. Acreage increased from 13,056 in 1983 to 15,897 in 1984.

Sugar beets was the second leading agricultural crop in terms of gross value with \$20,763,100.

Field corn dropped from the leading crop in 1983 to third in 1984 with a gross value of \$20,476,500, down \$2,923,500. Despite a total of 51,000 acres, price per unit was down.

Field crops in general were down \$656,700, although wheat acreage was up and nursery products were up. The overall production and prices were lower than 1983.

Fruit and nut crops were up \$1,579,500, due in part to a good growing season, absent of spring rains. Despite the codling moth problem in Suisun Valley, the pear price was up augmented by some highly producing orchards on Ryer Island.

Seed crops were up \$617,700 due to increased acreage.


Truck crops were up \$1,569,500 due to increased acreage of tomatoes, bell peppers, sweet corn and asparagus.

The gross value of animal production was up \$1,059,300 due to increases mainly in cattle, sheep, wool and milk prices.

I again emphasize that this report represents gross value of agricultural products and does not reflect any net return to the producer.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to those who have provided the information and records necessary to compile this report and to the growers of Solano County who make agriculture our most valued industry.
