

**RESOLUTION NO. 2022-03-18 b**

**Approving Subventions Agreement for Fiscal Year 2022-2023**

WHEREAS, Water Code Sections 12980 et seq. establish a program for state financial assistance to local agencies responsible for maintenance of nonproject and certain project levees in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta; and,

WHEREAS, these Sections require local agencies to enter into agreements with the Central Valley Flood Protection Board (Board) to perform maintenance and improvement work as approved by the Board in accordance with provisions and criteria adopted by the Board; and,

WHEREAS, the District has submitted and the Board has approved levee maintenance and improvement plans in accordance with those provisions and criteria; and,

WHEREAS, on November 24, 1997, as required by Water Code Sections 12307 and 78543, the Board, the Department of Water Resources (DWR), the Department of Fish and Game (DFG), and the Resources Agency executed Amendment No. 1 to the Memorandum of Understanding, requiring projects or plans to be consistent with a net long-term habitat improvement program in the delta; and,

WHEREAS, Water Code Section 12987 provides that expenditures must be consistent with a net long-term habitat improvement program and have a net benefit for aquatic species in the delta; and,

WHEREAS, the Board has presented the District with an agreement, entitled "Delta Levee Maintenance Subventions Program, Work Agreement, Fiscal Year 2022-2023" to cover the performance, inspection, reimbursement, and cost-sharing of maintenance and improvement work performed on non-project and eligible project levees by the District from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, the aforementioned agreement provides for reimbursement of 75% of the costs the District incurs in improving and maintaining eligible levees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1667 as follows:



1. The Board finds and determines that the aforementioned agreement is necessary and in the District's interests due to the cost-sharing provided for in the agreement.
2. The Board authorizes the execution of the aforementioned agreement by its President and authorizes its staff to undertake all other actions necessary to advance its completion.
3. The Board finds and determines the work contemplated under the agreement constitutes "maintenance" and is therefore not a "covered action" and is also exempt from CEQA.
4. Emma Mendonsa, Otome Lindsey, and Katie Wadsworth disclosed that they are non-compensated trustees of the District, and they are also employees of DWR and are paid salaries for that employment.
